August 26- 27, 2017

The 18th Hidden Valley Open Championships will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

Test Level: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event.

<u>Age Restrictions/Requirements</u>: Skaters entering juvenile free skate events (Well Balanced Program) must be under 14 years of age at the close of entries. Skaters entering open juvenile free skate events (Well Balanced Program) must be at least 14 years of age at the close of entries.

Entry Deadline is Saturday, July 29, 2017

Entries must be completed online via Entryeeze no later than 11:59pm, Saturday, July 29, 2017. Late entries, if accepted, will be charged a \$30 late fee. All age requirements are effective as of the close of entries. A credit card processing fee of 4.0% is charged by *The North County FSC*. Processing fees are not refundable, even if the event is canceled or skater withdraws before close of entries.

<u>Refund Policy</u>: Entry fees will not be refunded after July 31, 2017 unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$25.00 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in events. Notification of competition times will be available on Entryeeze.

Admission Fees: No admission fees will be charged. Each skater will receive his/her own Competitor's Credential. Each coach will receive one Coach's Credential. Coach must be a U.S. Figure Skating Member and a PSA registered Member.

Facilities: The competition will be held at Escondido IcePlex located at 555 North Tulip St., Escondido, California. The competition arena ice surface measures 100' by 200' with slightly rounded corners. **Music:** The North County Figure Skating Club music system will accommodate CD, CD-RW-CD (CD preferred). For best results, we recommend that program music be recorded on Music Quality CD disks. Additionally, CDs should be formatted so that music will begin to play immediately (no practice CDs for

the competition, please). Bring a backup copy of your music. The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in. Music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but The North County Figure Skating Club cannot be held responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. Please have separate CDs for practice and competition.

Liability: U.S. Figure Skating, The North County Figure Skating Club, and IcePlex accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

System of Judging: The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for the following events: Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior Short Programs; Open Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior Free Skate Program. The 6.0 System will be used for the following events: Pre-Juvenile and below Free Skate Programs, all Showcase Light and Dramatic Programs; all Compulsory Programs; all Compete USA programs. All competitors skating in IJS events need to submit the planned program content form online through Entryeeze. The deadline to submit the form is July 31, 2017.

Registration: A registration desk will be in the lobby of the IcePlex rink on the dates of the competition and will be manned commencing one hour prior to the start of each day's events. All competitors should check in at the registration desk at least 40 minutes prior to their scheduled event. The official bulletin board will list any schedule changes or other information needed by competitors. Events will not be delayed for competitors who arrive late. The competitors should also be ready to check in with the Ice Monitor 15 minutes prior to their event start time.

<u>Practice Ice</u>: Practice Ice prior to the competition must be arranged with IcePlex.

Video Taping and/or Photography: Contractual commitments with our Videographer and Professional Photographer require that we limit all private videotaping and still photographs to your own skater. Any spectator seen shooting either video or stills of a skater other than her/his own shall be removed from the arena. No flash photography is permitted in the arena at any time.

Awards: Medals will be awarded 1 through 4 in all events. There are no final rounds.

<u>Official Notices</u>: The official bulletin board will be located in the Arena Lobby and will list any schedule changes or other information needed by competitors.

Information Regarding Coaches: U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach Compliance

In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

- a. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member;
- b. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.
- c. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A, B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.
- d. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

For Compete USA Only coaches - Any person, 18 and older, instructing in a U.S. Figure Skating Learn to Skate Program must have successfully passed the annual background screen and be registered as a Learn to Skate instructor member.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without compliance is an ethics violation, which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

Showcase Events

Eligibility to Compete:

All entry qualifications must be attained as of July 29, 2017. Those eligible under U.S. Figure Skating Rules, reinstated skaters and representatives of other governing bodies may compete.

Showcase Events – Basis of Judging:

All entry qualifications must be attained as of July 29, 2017. Those eligible under U.S. Figure Skating Rules, reinstated skaters and representatives of other governing bodies may compete.

- a. Performances will be judged for theatrical and artistic qualities, from an entertainment standpoint.
- b. Technical skating skill and difficulty will not be rewarded as such; however, skating must be the major element of the performance and of sufficient quality to support the theatrical elements chosen.
- c. Unintended falls, poorly executed skating elements and obvious losses of control will reduce contestant's marks.
- d. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in showcase, therefore jumps, if choreographed, should be those performed with style, flow and confidence. Jumps should not be used but as the choreography requires.
- e. Theatrical elements evaluated will include: Energy, poise, acting, pantomime, eye contact, choreography, form, extension and the use of costumes, ice and props.
- **f.** One performance mark incorporating the 6.0 scoring system will be assigned each performance by each judge. No technical skating mark will be used. Any overtime penalties will be posted with the results.

Events:

Singles skaters, once qualified for a level, may enter any or all events for which they meet age and test requirements. Singles need not qualify separately for multiple events. Duets need not qualify but must meet test requirements stated in #6.

- a. Singles Events will be:
 - i. Dramatic Entertainment: A serious, emotional, artistic interpretation.
 - ii. *Light Entertainment*: Any performance not serious enough to be considered dramatic.
 - iii. Skaters may enter any or all of these single events at the level for which they are qualified.
- b. Duet: A theatrical/artistic performance by any two contestants. The highest test level of a duet member will determine the duet competition level.
- c. Singles contestants may enter events only at their ages and test levels as of July 25, 2017.

Specifics:

- 1. There is no minimum time requirement for any event.
- 2. Showcase events will not be segregated by gender.
- 3. The highest test level of a Duet member will determine the Duet Competition level.
- 4. Where the number of entrants requires the separation into groups, awards will be given to each group. There will be no final rounds for any Showcase event.
- 5. There will be a 0.2 deduction for each 5 seconds in excess of the maximum performance and prop placement time.
- 6. Timing starts with the first motion of the body and ends when motion stops. Props and scenery must be placed and removed by single and duet contestants within one minute. No assistance is allowed; violations will be penalized .2 for each 5 seconds excess time or assistance. Posted results will indicate any such deductions.
- 7. Preliminary and above Singles competitors who have passed the Preliminary FS test or higher and placed 1st through 4th in a showcase category qualify for National Showcase. Duets need not qualify by placement for National Showcase.
- 8. Groups for Showcase 1 and Showcase 2 will be divided by age.

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc., unless otherwise specified. Vocal music is allowed.
