The Picken Dance Classic competition will offer detailed critiques by National and World-ranked officials for eligible teams following each Pre-Juvenile through Senior Eligible Team Dance event. Critiques will be available for eligible teams entered in Open events, if requested in advance.

DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES

Secure Online Registration online and credit card payment will be available through the Registration link to EntryEeze on the Picken Dance Classic event page. The deadline for entry is **May 4, 2016**.

All entries submitted after May 4, 2016 must be approved by the Chief Referee and will be assessed a **\$50.00** late fee. Checks returned for insufficient funds and contested credit charges will be assessed a **\$50.00** fee. Payment of the fee will be required before a skater is allowed to participate in any event (practice ice or competition).

RULES

- 1. The Picken Dance Classic is open to eligible skaters in good standing with U. S. Figure Skating per ER 1.02 and will be governed by the rules specified in the 2016-2017 USFS Rulebook except as otherwise stated. Test level is as of **May 4, 2016**. The Committee reserves the right to combine age groups within test levels, or divide any event if necessary and to cancel any event with a full refund. Otherwise, there will be no refunds after the close of entries.
- 2. **PRO-AM TEST LEVEL EVENTS**: A dance couple will consist of an eligible skater and a coach. The eligible skater may not enter an event below his/her completed test level (standard, adult or masters). Age and test level are as of **May 4, 2016**. A coach may enter with two eligible partners in the same event with the understanding that skating order is by random draw.
- 3. The term COACH is defined as a person (eligible or ineligible) who receives direct financial benefit for instruction or partnering in ice dance. See INFORMATION REGARGING COACHES (compliance rules) below. Eligible skaters who teach free skating or Moves in the Field and not ice dance will be considered "an eligible skater" for this competition if they are part of an eligible team or the student in a Pro-Am Test Level event.
- SOLO DANCE EVENTS: Picken Dance Classic is a participating competition within the 2016 Solo Dance Series. For complete information, see the Solo Series Handbook. To register go to: <u>http://www.usfigureskating.org/Programs.asp?id=479</u>. Solo dance events in the Picken Dance Classic are open to both registered and non-registered skaters.
- 5. **MEDALS** will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place eligible (non-coach) skaters in all events.

- 6. SCORING SYSTEMS: IJS will be used for Juvenile through Senior eligible team events, Pattern Dance, Short Dance and Free Dance. IJS may be used on selected Open dance events, as indicated. The 6.0 system will be used for the Pre-Juvenile Pattern Dance event, all Pro-Am events, and all Solo Dance events. <u>Under the 6.0 system, ties will be broken by the placement in the final segment.</u>
- 7. NUMBER OF PATTERNS TO BE SKATED For all IJS judged dances and Series Solo dances:

A. Two sequences: Swing Dance, European Waltz, American Waltz, Tango, Starlight Waltz, Westminster Waltz, Argentine Tango, Austrian Waltz, Cha Cha Congelado, Yankee Polka, Ravensburger Waltz, Tango Romantica, Silver Samba, Golden Waltz, Midnight Blues and Finnstep.

B. Three sequences: Dutch Waltz, Canasta Tango, Rhythm Blues, Cha Cha, Fiesta Tango, Hickory Hoedown, Willow Waltz, Ten Fox, Blues, Paso Doble and Viennese Waltz.

C. Four sequences: Fourteenstep, Foxtrot, Rocker Foxtrot, Quickstep and Rhumba.

D. Six sequences: Kilian.

For all Pro Am Test Level dances and Open 6.0 judged dances, see the patterns required for tests.

- 8. **SHORT DANCE & FREE DANCE COMPETITORS**: Eligible teams in IJS events must submit their PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM in EntryEeze (go to your account and click on the "Planned Program Content" tab). The deadline to submit the PPCS online is 1 June 2016.
- 9. **CDs:** For all Eligible Team events and Adult Free Dance competitors should bring 2 copies of their music on CD. CDs must only have one track. Online, .mp3 files may be uploaded to Entryeeze after registering for this competition. CD's will still be required as a backup.
- 10. **LIABILITY**: US Figure Skating, the Washington Figure Skating Club and the Skatequest Reston facility accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. See rule 1600.

ANY CHANGES IN THE CURRENT DANCE RULES THAT ARE MADE BY THE ISU, OR AT THE 2016 GOVERNING COUNCIL AND THAT ARE EFFECTIVE 1 JUNE 2016 WILL BE IN EFFECT AT THIS COMPETITION.

SCHEDULE

A tentative schedule will be available approximately two weeks prior to the competition. The schedule will be available on the Picken Dance Classic event page and via the EntryEeze link.

RINK FACILITIES

All events will be held at the SkateQuest Reston Ice Rink, Reston, Virginia. The competition rink is Olympic size, measuring 100' x 200'.

HOTELS

There are no special rates arranged at this time with Reston area hotels. Information and links will be available on the Picken Dance Classic event page and via the EntryEeze link.

PRACTICE ICE

Practice ice will be available for purchase once the competition schedule has been finalized by the Chief Referee and can be reserved in advance through the EntryEeze link on the competition website. This will be approximately 2 to 3 weeks prior to the competition. There is no fee for coaches to skate on practice sessions.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES:

U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 – Coaches Registration:

In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

A. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating – either through a member club or as an individual member

B. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.

C. Must complete the appropriate CER course (A, B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR. 5.12. Minimum level B for the Picken Dance Classic.

D. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

The local organizing committee will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the Picken Dance Classic. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D., is not on the approved list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential - <u>no exceptions</u>. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without proper registration is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

U.S. Figure Skating and the LOC appreciate the cooperation and understanding of all U.S. Figure Skating members to help implement minimum requirements to ensure that the environment in all U.S. Figure Skating programs is as safe as possible for all participants. This will help give parents the highest degree of confidence that their children are not only receiving good care and proper instruction but are safe from improper conduct. ELIGIBLE TEAM EVENTS

The level qualifications will be as defined in the 2016-17 Rulebook. Teams may skate up one level. The latest ISU rules for the 2016-17 season will be used where applicable. Pattern Dance events have both initial rounds and final rounds, all teams will skate both rounds of pattern dance—the initial round is not a qualifying round. If USFS dance selections change from the time of announcement to the competition, the latest selections will be used.

Each Juvenile through Novice couple may provide their own music for each pattern dance within the Pattern Dance event. The Skater Choice music may be +/- 2 beats per minute different from the tempo as stated in the dance description of the called dance and may include vocals, in accordance with US Figure Skating Rulebook 6221, 6231, 6241.

The Picken Dance Classic is a participating competition within the 2016 Solo Dance Series.

The solo pattern dance event, solo combined event and shadow dance events are being offered and will be conducted in accordance with the 2016 Solo Dance Series Handbook found at http://www.usfigureskating.org/Programs.asp?id=479. Please refer to the 2016 Solo Dance Series handbook for the current Series rules, levels and event requirements that will be in effect for this competition.

Each skater who registers with U.S. Figure Skating as a participant in the 2016 Series will receive a Solo Dance Series Participant number upon successful payment and registration. This registration and number is required for a Series participant and accrue points.

A skater <u>not registered</u> as a 2016 Solo Dance Series participant is welcome to enter the solo and shadow dance events at or above the dance test completed.
