The 2017 Sun Valley Summer Championships will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

SERIES INFORMATION: This competition has been designated as a National Solo Dance qualifying event and will be run in accordance with the 2017 Solo Dance Series Complete Handbook.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline, in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event and not at multiple levels in the same event during the same competition. Skaters may not enter both a Well-Balanced Free Skate event and a Test Track Free Skate event. Girls and Boys will be combined in events as per the US Figure Skating rules. Events with large numbers of entries may be split by age or test level into multiple, equal-sized groups. Events may be skated with more than six skaters per warm up group.

<u>AGE RESTRICTIONS/ REQUIREMENTS</u>: Events with age restrictions or requirements will be as of the closing entry date of entries.

ENTRIES: The entry deadline is June 12, 2017 at 11:59 pm. All entries are to be made online <u>Click here for</u> Entryeeze competition page and look for the SV Summer Championships logo or use their search bar. Entry fee for the first event is \$95.00 and \$50.00 for each additional event.

<u>REFUND POLICY</u> There will be no refunds given for withdrawal after the close of the entries. Refunds will be issued in accordance with Rule 3047 and only if the event is not held. In any event with only one entry, the skater will be offered the choice of either competing as an individual competitor in accordance with Rule 3045A without a refund, or withdrawing from the event and receiving a refund. All refunds, minus the online process fee, will be returned to your credit card within 30 days of the end of the competition based on determination of the LOC that a refund is due. The online processing fee is not refundable for any reason. No refunds will be issued for injuries. You will be asked the following "survey" question during Entryeeze registration: "If you are the only skater in any of the events you entered, would you prefer to skate anyway, or withdraw from the single skater event with a refund." Your response to this question is final and will help us process the schedule quicker.

All events will be held on the indoor arena on Thursday, July 20, July 21, and July 22. <u>ALL EVENTS ON SUNDAY JULY 23 WILL BE HELD ON THE OUTDOOR RINK (WEATHER PERMITTING).</u> Official practice ice for Sunday's events will be available at the outdoor rink Sunday before the events start.

MUSIC: Competitors are required to upload their music to Entryeeze after registering for this competition. CD's will still be required as a backup. CDs must only have one track. Skaters should have a spare CD nearby during

their performance. Please follow the steps at <u>Entryeeze.com</u> log into your skater account and follow instructions as to how to upload in <u>mp3</u> format. The deadline to upload music into Entryeeze is Sunday, July 16.

JUDGING SYSTEM: The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for the following events: Well balanced free skate events, Preliminary thru Senior (including Open Juvenile) and Adult Gold Thru Master Junior-Senior. Short Program events, Juvenile to Senior.

The 6.0 Majority Judging System will be used for Test Track and all other events. Sun Valley FSC reserves the right to use the 6.0 judging system for any IJS events when IJS qualified officials are unavailable. National Solo Dance events will be judged in accordance with the 2017 Solo Dance Series Complete Handbook.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM (PPC) All competitors skating in IJS judged (see judging System section) are required to submit their planned program content form with their entry online via <u>www.Entryeeze.com</u>. Revisions to a skater's PPC will be accepted via Entryeeze thru July 16, 2017. Competitors not submitting their PPCs via Entryeeze will be required to provide a paper PPC prior to registering and will be subject to a \$35.00 late fee.

<u>REGISTRATION</u>: Registration will begin on Wednesday July 19, 2017 at 1pm and remain open throughout the competition. Please register promptly upon arrival.

<u>PRACTICE ICE</u> Official Practice Ice is available on Wednesday July 19, beginning at approximately at 1:30pm. Skaters may purchase two sessions on Wednesday July 19 and music will be played on a first come first serve basis, time permitting on each session. Skaters must have CD's for practice sessions.

Warm up Sessions will be available thru Sunday. Skaters may purchase one session of warm-up ice per day. No music will be played on these sessions. Please make practice ice reservations along with your online entry no later than June 12, 2017. Skaters must purchase practice ice with their online entry to ensure space. Skaters will be notified via Entryeeze when practice ice selection times are available, skaters should log into their Entryeeze account and select their practice times. Additional practice ice prior to July 19 can be purchased directly through the ice rink at the Sun Valley resort website www.sunvalley.com or by calling 208-622-2192.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO A professional videographer and photographer will be available at the competition for both performance video and podium photos. No flash photography or outside videotaping will be allowed.

<u>AWARDS</u> will be presented as close as possible to the conclusion of each event. Medals will be awarded to the top four places in all events. Skaters entering both the short and free skate program events, at the same level will be eligible for overall awards in Juvenile thru Senior events based on the greatest combined IJS point total for the Short and Free Skate programs.

The Phyllis Kourland Trophy will be presented for the most outstanding performance in the Intermediate Thru Senior Dramatic events.

There will be a Trophy presented to the most outstanding performance in No-Test Thru Juvenile Dramatic events.

There will be an Outstanding Light Entertainment performance award given to a skater at the No-Test Thru Juvenile level.

There will be an Outstanding Light Entertainment performance award given to a skater at the Intermediate Thru Senior level.

<u>OFFICIAL NOTICES</u> and schedule showing starting times for each event and the draw will be posted in the indoor arena. The official schedule supersedes all other schedules. Notices posted on the SVFSC bulletin board are considered as sufficient notice to all competitors. Skaters are to be in the rink and ready to skate <u>60</u> minutes before their event is scheduled to begin. In the event that the competition runs ahead of schedule, events will not be delayed for skaters who arrive late. Decisions by the Referee in all matters will be final.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach Compliance.

In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating - either through a member club or as an individual member;

Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A, B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

For Learn to Skate USA ONLY coaches - Any person, 18 and older, instructing in a Learn to Skate USA program must have successfully passed the annual background screen and be registered as a Learn to Skate USA instructor member.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non- credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without compliance is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

Sun Valley SummerChampionships Compete USA Announcement July 22 & 23, 2017

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Learn to Skate USA program and those who are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with Learn to Skate USA or a member club. There will be no more than six competitors maximum in an event and all six should receive an award.

Eligibility and Test Requirements:

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries.

All Snowplow Sam and Basic 1-6 skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed, including Moves in the Field or individual dances.

For the Pre-Free skate, Free skate 1-6, test track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (Moves in the Field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher, but not both levels in the same event during the same competition. Skaters may not compete at more than one level in the same type event at the same competition.

It is very important to the success of the competition that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the Local Organizing Committee discovers that a skater has been placed in a category that is below his/her class level, the chairman and referee will have the option to move the skater into the proper division, even if this has to be done the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors. Referee driven format examples: all skaters perform first element before moving on to the next and so on, or each skater performs all the required elements before moving on to the next skater.

To be skated on 1/3 to 1/2 ice.

No music.

All elements must be skated in the order listed.

PROGRAM EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM - BASIC 6

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise specified. Vocal music is allowed.

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program. Vocal music is allowed.

To be skated on full ice. The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use but is not required to use any additional elements from previous levels A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher I e v e I Time Max 1:40 Program Elements: <u>Click Here</u> Then select correct level. **SHOWCASE EVENTS: Light Entertainment or Dramatic** Showcase events are open to skaters in Basic 1- 6 and Pre-Free Skate thru Free Skate 6. Groups may be divided by the referee/LOC based on the number of entries, test levels and ages if justified by the number of entries. Skaters must enter at the same level as their free skate event or highest test level of skater's in the group ensemble or production number. If a free skate event is not being entered, skaters must enter at their current test level or one level higher. Vocal music is permitted.

EVENT: Showcase Interpretative Events

Format: Interpretive is a performance choreographed by the competitor, unaccompanied and unassisted, to music supplied by the competition committee / LOC. Programs should incorporate various elements of expressive movement and skating moves, to enhance the skater's interpretation of the music, rather than technical elements.

- The music will be played twice during an on-ice warm-up prior to the performance.
- Skaters after the warm up will go back to a room, with no music being played.
- Skaters will be brought to the ice when the previous skater finishes.
- All competitors in an event will interpret the same music.
- Props are permitted but must be brought into the room prior to listening to the music, and be taken to the ice only when the skater is called to perform. Props may not be pre-positioned on the performance surface.
