GENERAL RULES:

The Buckeye Adult Open will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

Adult Competition Series:

This competition is participating in the inaugural season of the **Adult Competition Series**. The Adult Competition Series was developed to provide a series of events for Adult 1 through Adult Bronze levels. Skaters will accumulate points based upon placement in the Free Skate and Compulsory Moves events.

Skaters must compete in **both** the compulsory moves and the free skate event in at least two participating competitions during the Series season with one of the competitions being the Nonqualifying competition associated to the Adult Sectional Championships **in their home section**; however only the skater's best **three** point finishes (calculated by adding the points from the compulsory moves event and the free skate event together and in case there are multiple events with the same point total, the events with the better tie-breaker results will be counted) will be used towards their total point accumulation to determine the final Adult Competition Series winners in each section.

Skaters must be registered (\$20 fee) with USFSA for the Adult Competition Series before participating at Buckeye to have their points earned collected. ELIGIBILITY AND LIABILITY:

The competition is open to ALL skaters age 18 and older who are current eligible members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating in good standing for the 2017-2018 season. Skaters may compete in as many disciplines as qualified by test level and age. Age and test qualifications as of September 30,

2017 (close of entries), will determine classification. All skaters may skate at, or one level above, their highest test level, but not both (with the exception of Solo Dance and Open Dance). At the referee's discretion, men and women may be combined into a single event, and events may be divided or combined by age group, or canceled.

U.S. Figure Skating, PSC and Community Center of Cleveland Heights accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

AGE CATEGORIES:

The following age categories apply to all events:

Young Adult: 18 to 20 years Class I: 21 to 35 years Class II: 36 to 45 years Class III: 46 to 55 years Class IV: 56 to 65 years Class V: 66 years and over

ENTRIES AND FEES:

All entries must be postmarked or received online no later than September 30, 2017. The entry fee must be included with the completed application. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the competition committee and referee, and will be subject to a \$20 late fee. Skaters wishing to change their event after the close of entries may be subject to a \$20 change of event fee. There will also be a \$20 service fee for returned checks. First solo event (if Full ice event): \$80.00 (\$90.00 if IJS event)

First solo event (if Learn To Skate USA event or Half-ice event): \$45.00

First partnered event (Dance, Pairs, Couples Showcase): \$45.00 per skater

Each additional solo event (Full ice, Half ice, or LTS USA): \$45.00 per event

Each additional partnered event: \$25.00 per person, per event

REFUNDS:

Entry fees will not be refunded after September 30, 2017 unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$20 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

SCHEDULE:

A final competition and practice ice schedule will be posted on Entryeeze approximately 10 days prior to the competition. Link found through PSC's web site: http://www.pavilionfsc.com/. Every effort will be made to have the entire competition take place on Saturday. If needed, the competition will continue on Sunday.

ARENA FACILITIES:

All events will be held at Cleveland Heights Community Center, which has dressing rooms, a snack bar, arena seating, and free parking. The ice surface measures 200' by 100' (Primary Rink - Olympic) or 185x85 (secondary rink). Admission to the Buckeye Adult Open competition is free.

MUSIC:

The skater must provide their own music for all Freeskating, Dramatic Skate, Light Entertainment Skate programs, Solo Free Dance, **AND PATTERN DANCES*** on music CDs only (no tapes or data CDs will be accepted). CDs should be clearly marked with the name of the skater, event entered and length of music (not skating time). The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in. A duplicate CD should be readily available. Music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but the PSC of Cleveland Heights cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. Please have separate CDs for practice and competition.

* PSC will provide pattern dance music if skaters forget to bring their own set of music.

LIABILITY:

U.S. Figure Skating, PSC of Cleveland Heights, and Cleveland Heights Community Center accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

JUDGING SYSTEM:

IJS will be used for the Free Skating events at the Silver through Masters levels for SINGLES freeskating events and spins events only. The 6.0 Majority Judging system will be used for all other events.

REGISTRATION:

Registration will begin immediately at the time the announcement is released, and end at 11:59pm EST on September 30, 2017. The Registration desk will be open one to two hours before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located in the atrium of the Cleveland Heights Community Center. Please register promptly upon arrival.

PRACTICE ICE:

There will be practice ice available Friday evening October 27 and Saturday morning, October 28, 2017. There may be other practice ice times during Saturday and/or Sunday, depending on ice availability, pre-registration demand, and competition scheduling. The pre-paid rate for practice ice is \$12.00 for 25 minutes per skater. Skaters may also purchase practice ice at a walk-on rate of \$15 per 25 minutes if space is still available. Please pre-register for practice ice using the online registration system linked at http://www.pavilionfsc.com/

You will be able to select practice ice times online after the competition schedule is completed. **Practice ice selection is done on a first-come, first-served basis for all skaters who pre-register.** All skaters registered for the competition will receive a confirmation message from the EntryEeze Online Registration system with a PIN. Use your PIN and US Figure Skating number to select practice ice time. After pre-registered skaters have an opportunity to select practice ice, all other skaters will have the opportunity to purchase and select practice ice at the "walk-on" rate.

JUDGES' CRITIQUES:

Skaters will have the opportunity to register for an additional judges' critique for their Freeskating events. A judge from an event's panel will meet with registered skaters of that event shortly after the event concludes, and will give the skater feedback on his/her performance. Judges' critiques are offered to skaters of ANY level, regardless of if the event is judged under 6.0 or under IJS. In order to bring in extra officials to allocate time in the judging schedule for critiques, we ask competitors to sign up for a critique at the time of registration. The cost is \$10 per critique. Please limit one critique per skater.

SCRATCHES:

If you become unable to compete, please be courteous to your fellow competitors and organizing committee by contacting BuckeyeAdultOpen@gmail.com as soon as possible. No refunds will be issued for scratched events.

AWARDS-

All events will be final rounds. Awards will be presented to first through fourth places. Awards will be available after the results are posted. For podium pictures, please arrive at the awards table shortly after the posting of results so we can announce the awards as a group.

<u>Videography</u>: Videography will be taken at the event, please purchase your copies through the vendor at the rink during the competition.

EVENT PROGRAM:

An official Buckeye Adult Open program will be provided to all competitors. To place a "Good Luck" ad, order online through Entryeeze before September 30, 2017. Please note that late entries may not appear in the official program.

OFFICIAL NOTICES:

An official notice board will be maintained at the registration desk. It is the responsibility of each competitor and coach to check the board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive at least 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES:

U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach Compliance

In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

- A. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member;
- B. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.
- C. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A,B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.
- D. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

For Learn To Skate USA ONLY coaches - Any person, 18 and older, instructing in a Learn To Skate USA program must have successfully passed the annual background screen and be registered as a LTS USA instructor member.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential. If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – <u>no exceptions</u>. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without compliance is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

- Vocal music is permitted for all events as per Rule 4040.
- Skaters may compete at or one level higher than their current US Figure Skating freeskating test level.
- Well-Balanced Program rules apply for all free skating events.
- IJS scoring will be used for Masters, Gold, and Silver events.

V. SHOWCASE EVENTS

DRAMATIC ENTERTAINMENT, LIGHT ENTERTAINMENT, AND DUET EVENTS:

All Showcase events shall be conducted according to the current National Showcase guidelines. These can be found at www.usfigureskating.org, under "Programs" on the National Showcase page. Dramatic Skate, Light Entertainment Skate, and Duet events are separate events, and a skater may enter any or all of these events.

Format:

- **Dramatic Entertainment:** Programs should express intense emotional connection and investment in the music, choreography and theme concept through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions. The entire gamut of emotions may be expressed including intense joy and/or introspectiveness.
- **Light Entertainment:** Showcase program that should express a carefree concept or storyline designed to uplift and entertain the audience through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions.
- **Duet Events:** Duets are theatrical performances by any two competitors.
- Props and Scenery are permitted. Please refer to the National Showcase guidelines for specifics on props, scenery, and costumes.
- Technical skating skills and difficulty <u>will not be rewarded</u>. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in showcase; therefore, jumps, if choreographed, should be performed with style, flow, and confidence.
- The 6.0 judging system will be used. One mark will be awarded by each judge for each performance. No technical skating mark will be awarded.

General event parameters:

- 1. Level will be determined by the highest free skate or dance (solo or partnered) test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or skate up to one level higher. Duets must compete at the highest test level of the two skaters.
- 2. The determination of level will be based upon test requirement at the entry deadline.

EXTEMPORANEOUS IMPROVISATION EVENTS:

Showcase Events – Interpretive Events

Format: Interpretive is a performance choreographed by the competitor, unaccompanied and unassisted, to music supplied by the competition committee / LOC. Programs should incorporate various elements of expressive movement and skating moves, to enhance the skater's interpretation of the music, rather than technical elements.

- The music will be played continuously during a 30-minute off-ice session in a room and twice during an on-ice warm-up prior to the performance.
 - o The room will be attended only by the adult monitor assigned to play the music and the competing skaters.
- After the warm up, skaters will go back to a room, with no music being played.
- Skaters will be brought to the ice when the previous skater finishes.
- All competitors in an event will interpret the same music.
- Props are permitted but must be brought into the room prior to listening to the music, and be taken to the ice only when the skater is called to perform. Props may not be pre-positioned on the performance surface.

VI. TEAM MANEUVERS

In this event, each maneuver listed will be performed on full ice by a member of a 3-5 person team. Both men and ladies may compete on the same team. Each member of a team may perform one or two maneuvers. However, a skater may not perform more than one element in each category (i.e. one skater cannot perform all of the jumps, etc). Skaters on a team do not have to represent the same club. A skater may not represent more than one team.

Teams must have a team name and a team captain (a contact person). The team captain is responsible for the entry fee, and should submit the names of team members at the time of registration. If a team member is unable to compete due to illness or injury, a teammate may perform the maneuver in the absent skater's place, provided that no individual member on a team is performing more than two maneuvers. A team may list one alternate skater.

Competition format:

- 1. When the event is called, all skaters will take the ice for a 2-minute STROKING ONLY warmup.
- 2. Skaters will be directed to find a "base" for their team somewhere on the ice (along the boards).
- 3. The referee will call the first element (e.g. solo spin).
- 4. The designated skater from each team will have approximately 30 seconds to warm up the called element.
- 5. The referee will direct the designated skater from each team to perform the element, one at a time.
- 6. Once all teams have had their skater complete the element, the next element will be called. Repeat #3-6.

Each element will be evaluated by the judges, but final placements will be determined by the combined performance of the entire team. Connecting moves between elements will not be considered in the scoring of this event. No props may be used at any time in the team competition.
