The Northeast ISC Winter Classic will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website. This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club (basic skills or full member), a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

<u>Eligibility:</u> The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills program/club or any other Basic Skills program/club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All **Snowplow Sam and Basic Skills 1-6** skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including Moves in the Field or individual dances.

For the **Pre-Free Skate, Free Skate 1-6, Introductory, Test Track and Well Balanced levels**, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (Moves in the Field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher but not both levels in the same event during the same competition. Skaters may not compete at more than one level in the same type event at the same competition.

<u>Entries</u>: Entries will be accepted online only via EntryEeze and must be entered no later than midnight January 7, 2018. A link to the entry form may be found at www.northeastisc.com. Late entries will be accepted only at the discretion of the organizers and only if the limit has not been reached. Late entries must be accompanied with an additional 30.00 late entry fee. Entries are limited to the first 200 applicants received. See below for \$10.00 early-bird discount on applications submitted prior to midnight, Dec 15, 2017.

Entry fees will not be refunded after entry deadline unless no competition exists or the event is cancelled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$25.00 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in events. An Early-bird discount of \$10 on 1st EVENT ONLY is allowed if sub-mitted online prior to midnight, **December 15, 2017**. The correct entry fee must accompany all applications. Applications received with the incorrect amounts will not be processed.

<u>Awards</u>: Everyone will receive an award at the basic skills levels. All other events will receive medals for 1st-4th place finishes. All events will be final rounds. Awards will be presented at appropriate times throughout the event.

Schedule of Events: The schedule of events will be posted on the Northeast ISC website (www.northeastisc.com) no later than seven days prior to the competition.

<u>Music</u>: The music for all free skating programs must be provided on compact disc (standard compact disc format only). Music must be clearly marked with the name of the skater, event entered and length of music. Each disc must have only one track on it. It is strongly recommended that the skater or coach bring more than one copy of music. The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in. A duplicate CD should be readily available. Music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but Northeast ISC cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. Please have separate CDs for practice and competition.

<u>Facilities:</u> The competition will be held at The Haverhill Valley Forum located at 7 Parkridge Road, Haverhill, MA 01835. www.valleyrinks.com. Ice surface is 200x85.

Judging System: The 6.0 Majority Judging System will be used for ALL events

<u>Registration</u>: Registration will be open one hour before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located in the lobby of the rink. Please register promptly upon arrival. Skaters are requested to arrive 60 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition at northeastisc.com. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information.

Locker Rooms & Changing Areas: This event will be following the Locker Rooms and Changing Area policy included in the SafeSport Handbook.

<u>Photography</u> / **Videography**: Photography & videography will be available for this event. More details TBA.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES: U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach Registration. In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

A. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating - either through a member club or as an individual member; B. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.

C. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A, B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.

D. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

For Learn to Skate USA ONLY coaches - Any person, 18 and older, instructing a Learn to Skate USA Program must have successfully passed the annual background screen, be registered as a Learn to Skate USA instructor and completed the Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification or U.S. Figure Skating Coach Compliance.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential. If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – <u>no exceptions</u>. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without proper registration is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.



COMPETITIVE PROGRESSION THROUGH THE LEVELS OF U.S FIGURE SKATING

Singles athletes begin with Compete USA competitions, progress to the introductory levels, then choose whether to follow the Test Track or Well-Balanced levels. Skaters move between tracks at different nonqualifying competitions, but may not enter the same type of event in multiple tracks. Competitive level is based from a skater's current test level.

EVENT: 2017-18 Test Track Free Skate – Introductory through Senior levels

General event parameters:

- 1. Skaters may <u>not</u> enter both a Well-Balanced Free Skate event and a Test Track Free Skate event at the same nonqualifying competition.
- 2. Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted at all levels.
- 3. Level will be determined by the highest Free Skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or "skate up" to one level higher.
- 4. Minimum number of spin revolutions are in () following the spin description. Revolutions must be in position.
- 5. The following deductions will be taken:
 - 0.1 from each mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
 - 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra element included.
 - 0.1 from the technical mark for any spin that is less than the required minimum revolutions.
