Ice Fest 2018 will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating or Skate Canada member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

NATIONAL SOLO DANCE SERIES EVENT INFORMATION

The Solo Pattern Dance event, Combined Event, and Shadow Dance events are being offered as part of the U.S. Figure Skating Solo Dance Series. Events will run in accordance with the 2018 U.S. Figure Skating Solo Dance Series Handbook found <u>here</u>. All skaters, regardless of participation in the NSDS series, may enter these events.

U.S. Figure Skating Solo Dance Series:

- SOLO DANCE SERIES SOLO PATTERN DANCE EVENT

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

Test level: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event.

Age restrictions/requirements: Skaters entering Juvenile Free Skate events (both Well Balanced and Test Track) must be under 13 years of age at the close of entries. Skaters entering Open Juvenile free skate events (Well Balanced and Test Track), must be at least 13 years of age at the close of entries.

Skaters entering Intermediate Free Skate events (both Well Balanced and Test Track) must be under 18 years of age at the close of entries. Skaters entering Open Intermediate Free Skate events (Well Balanced and Test Track) must be at least 18 years of age at the close of entries.

Skaters entering Beginner through Pre-Juvenile events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group. Events may be combined boys/girls at the discretion of the referee (per USFS guidelines).

ENTRIES: Online entry with secure credit card payment is available via <u>Entryeeze</u> at <u>http://seattleskatingclub.net/ice-fest/</u>. **Registration is ONLINE ONLY and must be completed by 11:59 PM on April 27, 2018.** Practice and Competition schedules will be available on the Entryeeze website approximately two weeks before the competition. It is essential that a current email address is available to the LOC via Entryeeze, as announcements for competitors will be emailed via the Entryeeze system, when possible.



Showcase entries must indicate both the entrant's Singles Free Skating test level and their Pattern Dance Test level to ensure placement in the correct showcase level in accordance with current U.S. Figure Skating guidelines.

Couples entering Ice Dance & Pairs Events must complete individual entries and payments through the Entryeeze registration system. You will be asked to indicate your partner's name.

Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee and the Local Organizing Committee and will be subject to a \$30 late entry fee. No entries will be accepted after the draw has been completed.

FEES: The following table indicates the fee structure for the 2018 Ice Fest Competition. Fees are determined by the number and type of events entered. If a skater enters only one event, pricing is indicated in the First Event column. If a skater enters multiple events, the first event is priced using the First Event column and subsequent events are priced using the Second Event column. Please note that certain events are only priced at First Event rates and do not qualify for Second Event pricing.

REFUND POLICY: Entry fees will not be refunded after the entry deadline unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$30 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events. Notification of competition and practice ice times will be available by through the Ice Fest website at www.entryeeze.com

<u>FACILITIES:</u> Ice Fest is hosted by the Seattle Skating Club and will be held at the Olympicview Training Center, 22202 70th Ave. West, Mountlake Terrace, WA. The ice surface is indoors, measures 100' X 200', with slightly rounded corners. More information on the rink can be found at <u>www.olympicviewarena.com</u>. The competition facility features locker room space (minimally 3), a café, and a pro shop.

<u>MUSIC UPLOAD/SUBMISSION</u> - Online music submission is the ONLY acceptable method to submit program music. After you have paid for your events, the system will prompt you to upload your music for each event that requires music. If your music is not available at that time, you can logout of your account and return later to upload your music by going to the "Competition" tab and then selecting "My Music." Please be sure you are uploading the correct music for the correct event segment. Be careful, for example, not to mix up your short program and your free skate! All music must be uploaded by May 4, 2018 11:59PM PT. A \$30 fee will be charged for late music upload.

The uploaded program music MUST conform to the following specifications:

- Programs per file: One (1) Only one piece of competition program music (e.g. Well balanced, Showcase, Interpretive etc.) per file is allowed.
- File Format: mp3 The uploaded file music must be an mp3 file (MPEG-1 or MPEG-2 Audio Layer III). Simply changing the file extension to "mp3" from another file format is not acceptable.
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps is requested (bit rates between 128 and 320 kbps will be accepted).

Maximum file size: 10 MB

Maximum run time: Five (5 minutes)



ID3 Metadata (tags):	None - The Chief Music Coordinator strongly requests that mp3 files DO NOT contain any ID3 metadata, commonly called tags. This is especially true of any embedded images such as album cover art, picture of the skater, etc. Please, NO EMBEDDED IMAGES!
Maximum leader:	The Chief Music Coordinator requests that there be NO leader. The leader is the silence between the start of the track and the actual start of the program music.
Maximum trailer:	The Chief Music Coordinator requests that there be NO trailer. The trailer is the silence between the end of the program music and the end of the actual track.

Backup Music at Event (CDs)

In addition to submitting the music online, all competitors/teams must also have at least one (1) backup copy of their competition music on CD, AT RINKSIDE, during the actual competition event segment. CDs must meet the following requirements:

- In standard Audio CD format (Compact Disc Digital Audio). Other formats, including mp3 are NOT acceptable.
- Clearly marked with a permanent marker (e.g. Sharpie, do NOT use a label or tape) as follows: First Name, Last Name, (Club – Optional but requested), Event, Event Segment and Music Length (e.g. Jane Smith, Acme FSC, Novice Ladies, Free Skate, 3:10 or Synchro Team, Widget FSC, Preliminary, Free Skate, 1:59)
- Each CD may have only ONE (1) music track on it. In the case where a skater competes in both a short program/dance and a free skate/free dance, two (2) separate discs must be available. Any disc with more than one (1) track is NOT acceptable.
- Lead in time (time before the music begins) on CDs may not exceed two (2) seconds.
- Due to the compatibility and reliability reasons, music may NOT be submitted on rerecordable "CD-RW" discs. PLEASE, no CD-RWs!!

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, Seattle Skating Club, and Olympicview Arena, Lynnwood Ice Center or Washington Ice Skating Association accepts no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

<u>JUDGING SYSTEM</u>: The International Judging System (IJS) under Rule 1070 will be used for the following events:

- Well Balanced Program Singles Free Skate events, Pre-Preliminary through Senior, Open Juvenile, and Open Intermediate
- Short Program Singles events, Juvenile/Open-Juvenile Senior
- Pairs Free Skate events, Pre-Juvenile Senior
- Pairs short program events, Intermediate Senior
- National Solo Dance Series Events
- Pre-Preliminary Preliminary FS may choose IJS or 6.0. Skaters may not register for both 6.0 and IJS events at the same level. For example, they must pick between Preliminary free skate 6.0 or Preliminary free skate IJS.

All competitors skating in these IJS events need to submit the planned program content form online. This form is found on Entryeeze. **The deadline to submit the form is 11:59 PM May 17, 2018.** A \$30 fee will be charged for late PPCs.



The 6.0 Majority Judging System under Rule 1060 will be used for all other events:

- Well Balanced Program free skate events: No-Test, Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary
- No-Test Pairs Free Skate Events
- Test Track Events: Pre-Preliminary Senior
- Showcase and Ensemble events
- Compete USA Events
- All interpretive events
- Solo Free Dance
- Couples Dance
- Pro-Am/Am-Am Pattern Dance
- Pre-Preliminary Preliminary FS may choose IJS or 6.0. Skaters may not register for both 6.0 and IJS events at the same level. For example they must pick between Preliminary Free Skate 6.0 or Preliminary free skate IJS.

The Chief Referee reserves the right to use the 6.0 system for any event for which IJS qualified officials are not available.

<u>REGISTRATION</u>: Registration will begin on Thursday, May 31, one hour before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration desk will be located in the rink lobby. Please register promptly upon arrival.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained on site. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. The schedule of events will be posted at registration prior to the competition.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS: This event will be following the Locker Rooms and Changing Area policy included in the SafeSport Handbook. Please visit <u>Here</u> for detailed information.

<u>PRACTICE ICE:</u> Practice Ice shall be scheduled through Entryeeze for all events. Each competitor may request one \$15.00/30min practice session per event entered (excluding interpretive events) for individual events, and two practice sessions per combined event. Skaters will be able to pick their own practice ice sessions online, but you MUST indicate number of sessions you want online when you register and MUST pay for them when you register online. You will receive an email with instructions on choosing practice ice time after the schedule has been set. Every effort will be made to schedule Practice ice sessions as close to the competition as possible, however this is not guaranteed.

NOTE: Depending on the size of the competition, practice ice selection might be limited to one or two time choices. Additional practice ice time may be held at Lynnwood Ice Center, as needed.

Practice Ice not pre-ordered will be sold on a first come-first serve basis, but we cannot guarantee additional practice sessions. If space permits, we will allow additional practice ice sales online for \$18.00/30 minutes per session after the schedule has been posted and those that pre-registered for sessions have had time to select their sessions. If space permits, additional practice ice will be available for purchase during the competition for \$20.00/30 minutes at the registration desk with cash or check only.



No Changes - No Refunds. Practice ice fees are nonrefundable, and you may not assign your practice ice to another skater.

Practice Ice Schedules will not be given over the phone but will be available on the Entryeeze website when available.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY: A professional video company and photographer will be at the rink. Any other professional photography/videography is prohibited. ALL award winners are encouraged to pose for the group picture. All other videotaping and photography is restricted to hand-held battery-operated equipment, without tripod, and is permissible only in the upper viewing area. No videotaping or photography from rink side. Videotaping or photography of any skater other than your own is strictly prohibited. Please be courteous to those viewing the event. Solicitation by any photographer or agent of anyone to be the subject of still or video photography is not permitted. For safety reasons, no flash photography is allowed during the event.

<u>AWARDS:</u> Individual events are separate and considered final rounds. Combined event overall placements will be determined by the combination of results from the initial and final rounds. Awards will be presented at the photographer's table immediately after the official posting of each event for individual events. For combined events, awards will be presented after each event segment, in addition to the overall combined final placement. Awards will be given for first through sixth place for all events. Award Photographs will be taken and we ask that all award winners pose for the group picture even if you do not plan on purchasing a picture.

Compete USA events will have no more than six skaters per group and all will receive an award.

Special Awards to be presented at the completion of the appropriate events. The perpetual trophies will remain in the SSC showcase, engraved with the skater's name. The winning skater shall also receive a personal award from the Seattle Skating Club.

Awards placement for the "Special Awards" shall be determined by the event judges.

- Rosalynn Sumners Seattle Skating Club "Artistic Award" Awarded to an Intermediate and above skater for exceptional Artistic Performance as determined by the event judges.
- The Shirle Irene Lander Trophy Awarded to a Juvenile and below skater for exceptional Artistic Performance as determined by the event judges.
- "The Hadley Award" This shall be awarded to a skater of any level who demonstrates excellence in both artistic and free skating and also represents the spirit of figure skating at the Ice Fest Event as determined by the event judges. Seattle Skating Club members, Ila Rae & Ray Hadley, were the 1960 US Silver Pairs Champions & 1957 Junior Pairs National Champions. They, along with their coach and mother Linda Hadley, perished with the other members of the 1961 U.S. World Team when their plane crashed en route to the World Championships. This special award is made in their name.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES:

U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach Registration

In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

A. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating - either through a member club or as an individual member;



- B. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.
- C. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A, B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.
- D. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

For Learn to Skate USA ONLY coaches - Any person, 18 and older, instructing a Learn to Skate USA Program must have successfully passed the annual background screen, be registered as a Learn to Skate USA instructor and completed the Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification or U.S. Figure Skating Coach Compliance.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential - <u>no exceptions</u>. We strongly urge *all* coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without proper registration is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

OFFICIALS: Competition officials will be selected in accordance with Rule 3030, except that officials for basic skills events will be selected in accordance with Rule 3120.

REFEREE: The decision of the Referee on all matters will be final. The Referee, along with the LOC, shall have the right to exclude any person(s) whose behavior is unruly or unsportsmanlike. Additionally, the Referee reserves the right to combine or split events to best accommodate the number of entries and schedule of events.

Allowance for Skate Canada requirements in U.S. Figure Skating Events

In general, Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile Free Skate events, and Intermediate through Novice short program and free skate events will be judged in accordance with the time and content requirements and restrictions specified in the current US Figure Skating rulebook.

It is preferred that Canadian entrants in these events review the time and element content of their programs against the U.S. Figure Skating time and content requirements and restrictions and adjust their programs as necessary to ensure full credit for elements completed. However, because of the many differences between the US Figure Skating and Skate Canada time and content requirements and restrictions for the 2017-2018 season, Canadian entrants will be allowed to skate their programs as choreographed under Skate Canada rules, subject to the technical and judging evaluation conditions outlined below:

Pre-Juvenile through Novice Events

All element content executed within the US Figure Skating time (maximum for Novice short program and within allowance for free skate) and content maximums for jumps, spins and sequences will be evaluated. Skating in excess of the specified US Figure Skating time (maximum for Novice short program and within allowance for free skate) will not be penalized by the event referee, but elements completed after the maximum program time will not be evaluated by the judges.

Pre-Juvenile Free Skate

A spiral sequence within the US Figure Skating time allowance will be accepted and evaluated as a step sequence.

Juvenile Free Skate

A step sequence covering at least half the ice surface within the US Figure Skating time allowance will be accepted and evaluated as a choreographic sequence.

Intermediate Short Program

Canadian skaters completing their six required elements as choreographed under Skate Canada rules within the 2:30 Skate Canada maximum time will be accepted and fully evaluated by the judging panel without any time penalty from the event referee. A change sit spin of a minimum of 4-revolutions on each foot performed by a Canadian male skater will be accepted and evaluated as a substitute for the required spin in one position. A choreographic sequence will be accepted and evaluated as a base level step sequence.

Intermediate Free Skate

The first two spin elements within the US Figure Skating time allowance will be fully evaluated as performed. A third spin element will not be evaluated. A choreographic sequence will be accepted and evaluated as a base level step sequence.

Novice Free Skate

The first six jump elements in Novice Ladies and the first seven jump elements in Novice Men within the US Figure Skating time allowance will be fully evaluated as performed. A seventh jump element (for ladies) and an eighth jump element (for men) will not be evaluated. A choreographic sequence will be accepted and evaluated as a base level step sequence.

Final rounds will consist of the Free Skate event only, and will be skated on Saturday, June 2. Skaters who qualify for the final round will have the option of competing, and if so, will be required to pay an additional registration fee equal to the "Second Event" pricing for IJS individual events. Shadow Dance Event

The shadow pattern dance event is comprised of one pattern dance at each level.

- The free dance shall conform to Rule 6095, except that lifts are not allowed. These are entry level events with the intent of having the dance couple perform a creative dance program as defined by Rule 6095 in a variety of basic dance partner positions.

PRO-AM/AM-AM PATTERN DANCE EVENTS

A dance couple will consist of an eligible skater and a professional or two eligible skaters. Competitors may not enter an event below their completed test level (either adult or standard track) as of April 27, 2018. Competitors may skate up one level. Events may be divided by age. Couples must do both dances in each level. Dances will be scored separately with awards based on the combined results. - **Silver** One partner should not have passed their US Figure Skating Pre-Gold Dance test. Dances are Tango (ISU Pattern) and American Waltz (ISU Pattern).
- **Pre-Gold** One partner should not have passed their US Figure Skating Gold Dance test. Dances are Blues (3 patterns) and Paso Doble.

The costume restrictions of Rule 4030 do not necessarily apply, provided that the Non-Qualifying Showcase Competition Guidelines cited above are fully adhered to.
