Critiques will be offered for the following events only: Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior SP&FS, Senior SP&FS, Adult, Masters, and Collegiate.

Please see important information below regarding purchasing <u>Practice Ice</u> and our Awards procedures below.

The 2018 Colonial Classic Synchronized Skating Competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current Rulebook as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted of the U.S. Figure Skating web site.

This competition is open to all synchronized skating teams comprised of members who are eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and currently registered members of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current Rulebook. Refer to the current rule book for non-U.S. Citizens.

ELIGIBILITY / TEST AND AGE REQUIREMENTS: Skaters must meet the age requirements by the July 1st preceding this competition. Moves in the Field test requirements are as of the entry deadline.

ENTRIES: All applications must be received by: November 8, 2017

*Junior/Senior Short Program	Additional \$195 per team (as an additional event combined with free skate)
*Synchro Skills Team	\$60 per team, and \$15 per competitor

All Teams (except Synchro Skills teams): The entry fee is \$250 per event plus \$40 per competitor including alternates or \$45 per competitor not staying in a preferred hotel booked by AVANTI Travel*

*Junior & Senior Short program: A fee for the Junior and Senior short program will be an additional \$195 (without any additional per competitor fee) when it is skated in addition to the free skate program. When entered as a standalone event, the "All event" rate with per-skater fee applies.

*Synchro Skills teams: The entry fee for Basic Skills Beginner teams is \$60 per team and \$15 per competitor

All competition participant registrations must be submitted via the EntryEeeze website. No other methods of registration are allowed.

REGISTRATION TRANSACTION FEES: In addition to the entry fees listed above, for all registrations and practice ice purchased through EntryEeze, credit card transaction charges will be assessed a 3.5 % transaction fee of the final registration amount.

PAYMENT: Payment will be coordinated through EntryEeze. Acceptable payments forms are listed on the EntryEeze website. The Colonial Classic will not accept cash, checks, money orders or similar cash-like payment forms.



REFUND POLICY: Entry fees are non-refundable after the entry deadline (November 8, 2017) unless the event is cancelled by the organizers.

LATE ENTRY POLICY: Late entries **may** be allowed at the discretion of the Chief Referee and Local Organizing Committee (LOC) and will be assessed an additional fee of \$75. In the event an extension is granted, late entry rosters may not be able to be published in all the event materials (ie: program book).

NOTE: Any changes made to team rosters after the November 8th deadline, will be subject to a \$25 administrative fee for each change. Additionally, roster changes after the deadline may not be reflected in competition printed promotional materials.

To ensure participation, all payments must be received prior to competition start date.

FACILITIES: The competition will be held The DCU Center, 50 Foster Street, Worcester, MA. The DCU Center is a 10,000 seat state of the art arena, with an ice surface that measures 200' by 85'. There are several concessions stands throughout the arena as well as many local restaurants in and around Worcester.

<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> The DCU Center prohibits spectators from bringing in food or drinks into the arena. If there are any special dietary requirements, **please contact the LOC**, to seek alternate arrangements.

JUDGING SYSTEM:

The ISU Judging System (IJS) will be used for the following events:

- Juvenile
- Intermediate
- Novice
- Junior Short Program & Free Skate
- Senior Short Program & Free Skate
- Collegiate
- Adult

All teams competing in a level judged under the IJS will be required to complete a planned program content sheet. Each team's Planned Program Content sheet must be completed via EntryEeze at least 7 days before the start of the event.

The majority 6.0 Judging System will be used for the following events:

- Synchro Skills 1-3
- Preliminary
- Pre-Juvenile
- Open Juvenile
- Masters
- Open Adult
- Open Masters
- Open Collegiate

MUSIC: Only CDs (standard Compact Disk format) will be accepted. No homemade computer copies will be accepted. The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in, no later than one hour prior to the time of the team's locker room assignment for practice ice. All music must be picked up at the registration desk upon completion of the competition. CDs and cassettes will not be mailed back to competitors.



All teams must have an additional copy of their music available for practice sessions. Teams must also have an extra copy available at rink side during the actual competition event. The Colonial Figure Skating Club cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition and will not accept responsibility for damage or loss of music but will take every precaution to ensure its safety.

Due to compatibility and reliability reasons no music may be submitted on re-recordable "CDRW" discs. PLEASE HAVE SEPARATE CD'S FOR PRACTICE AND COMPETITION.

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, The Colonial Figure Skating Club, and the DCU Center accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

REGISTRATION AT COMPETITION:

A registration desk will be at the DCU Center main entrance lobby.

- Registration will open at 6 am on each day of the event, or at 5 am if practice ice begins at 6 am
- Teams should send ONE representative to register no later than one hour prior to the time of the team's locker room assignment for practice ice or competition, if not purchasing practice ice.
- The team coach will be required to sign off on the PPC forms for IJS teams 7 days prior to the competition. IJS teams will not be allowed on the ice for practice if the PPC form is not signed off on.
- Coaches must register separately to receive their credential (see coaching requirements section "INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES").

ADMISSION: Teams will be provided with credentials for each skater (note: only one credential will be issued for any cross skaters) and two chaperones. There will be a \$30.00 charge for any lost credential.

Each individual coach, as listed on Form 1, will receive ONE credential. Coaches will need to register on their own and must show a photo ID, proof of current PSA and U.S. Figure Skating membership in order to receive their credential.

All other individuals accompanying the team must purchase tickets to the event. Daily tickets are available at the box office per day for the following prices:

Friday evening (only in the event of the competition commencing on Friday night): General Admission price is \$10 for all spectators

<u>Saturday & Sunday:</u> General Admission price is \$22/person/day. <u>Exceptions:</u> Saturday & Sunday General Admission tickets for Seniors and Young Adults (ages 6-12) are \$20/person/day available AT THE BOX OFFICE ONLY. There is no charge for Active Military and children under six (6) for any of the days.

All ticket prices include a facility fee imposed by local community government. Pre-purchasing of tickets will not be made available by the competition committee.

PRACTICE ICE: Practice ice will be held at the competition rink.

Important information Summary

All practice ice will be sold through EntryEeze:

- All IJS event teams (except Collegiate), Masters and Open Collegiate teams, may purchase one 10 minute session for \$120.
- Collegiate teams may purchase one 12 minute session for \$120

SKATING

- 6.0 event teams (Preliminary, Pre Juvenile, Open Juvenile, Open Adult and Open Masters) may purchase one 8 minute session for \$100.
 - Synchro Skills Teams may only purchase one 5 minute practice ice session for \$60
 - Syncro Skills Teams should not purchase the 10 or 22 minute sessions offered immediately after the roster entry screen on EntryEeze.
- Junior and Senior Teams, participating in both Short Program and Free Skate, can purchase a 10 minute practice session for the Short Program, and 12 minute practice session for the Free Skate for \$220 (called "22 min Jr/Sr only") on EntryEeze.
 - All other teams that do not participate in both the short program and free skate segments may not purchase these "22 min Jr/Sr Only" sessions.

Detailed Information

- Practice ice will be available, beginning Friday morning, January 5, 2018, and will be sold one per team on a first come, first served basis. Teams that do not use our official housing coordinator AVANTI TRAVEL, will be charged an additional \$50.00 fee for practice ice
 - A 5 minute practice session will be offered to Synchro Skills teams a cost of \$60.
 - An 8 minute practice session will be offered to all other 6.0 events for \$100.
 - A 12 minute practice session (JR/SR free skate and Collegiate ONLY) will be available for \$120.
 - For all other IJS level teams, the cost for a 10 minute practice session will be \$120.
 - All 22 minute sessions (10 min. SP + 12 min. FS) will be available for Junior and Senior programs for \$220.
 - In the event there is extra practice ice available, teams will be contacted and provided the option to purchase additional slots.
- Practice ice schedules will be posted on the competition website as soon as available.
- For all IJS events: Official practice ice is mandatory. Your ice will be assigned in a BLOCK, by event, by the LOC. At your official practice ice, the team is obliged to skate the whole (entire) competition program (short program and free skate) either in one entire run-through or two halves. The music will be played twice. No stopping of music once it has started.
- Teams will be notified of their assigned slots, via email, as soon as possible after the close of registration.
- We will do our best to honor special requests for practice ice, but cannot guarantee all requests will be accommodated.

PHOTOGRAPHY / VIDEOGRAPHY: Professional videographers and photographers will be covering the competition. Videos and photos will be available for sale at the event. Please note that no commercial videos or photography will be allowed. No videos or photographs, other than those by the official videographers and photographers for the event, shall be made available for sale either during or following the event.

AWARDS: Places 1 through 4 will receive medals, with a trophy for first place in each event. There will be no awards for preliminary rounds, if held. Junior and Senior Short and free skate programs will be awarded as separate events. In the event of a tie, awards will be mailed to the teams as soon as possible after the event.

Award ceremonies will take place in the Lobby area, as soon as possible after the conclusion of each event. If a team is unable to stay for an award ceremony, \$50 fee to cover postage and handling will be charged to mail the awards within 2 weeks after the conclusion of the competition.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained at registration. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent, and/or coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 60 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted on the Colonial Classic website (www.colonialclassic.org) as soon as possible, prior to the competition.



INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES:

To coach at a U.S. Figure Skating non qualifying competition, a professional coach or choreographer must be:

- ✓ Declared by the skater or team in the registration process
- ✓ Listed as Coaches Education Requirement (CER) Category A or B for the current season
- ✓ Current with Coach Registration (requires annual fee and background check)
- ✓ A current member in good standing with U.S. Figure Skating

Only coaches included on the registration form will be issued a credential. The local organizing committee/club will have a list of coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential. Coaches who are NOT on the list will need to show proof of membership in U.S. Figure Skating, a Coaches Registration card, proof of Category A or B compliance and a photo I.D. at check in.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions.

<u>CRITIQUES:</u> We will offer judging critiques at the competition to coaches at no charge for IJS and 6.0 teams in divisions competing at SyS Nationals. These teams are defined as Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior SP&FS, Senior SP&FS, Adult, Masters and Collegiate. Critiques for the 6.0 events, excluding Synchro Skills Teams, may occur based only on the availability of judges and time constraints of the competition, as well as at the discretion of the organizing committee.

members may be 16 or 17. All must have passed the juvenile moves in the field test.

J. Junior:A team of 12 to 16 skaters. Skaters must be at least 13 and under 19 on the preceding July

1. All skaters must have passed the intermediate moves in the field test.

K. Senior: A team of 16 skaters. Skaters must be at least 15 on the preceding July 1 and have passed

the novice moves in the field test.

Well balanced program and short program: Rule 7200

L. Open Collegiate A team of 8 to 16 skaters. Skaters must have a high school diploma or equivalent and be

enrolled in a college or university as a full-time student, as of the entry deadline.

Program duration: 3 minutes.

Well balanced program: Rule 7290

M. Collegiate: A team of 12 to 20 skaters. Skaters must have a high school diploma or equivalent and be

enrolled in a college or university as a full-time student, as of the entry deadline, and have

passed the juvenile moves in the field test.

Program duration: 4 minutes.

Well balanced program: Rule 7280

N. Open Adult: A team of 8 to 16 skaters. The majority of skaters must be at least 19 years or older.

Program duration: $2 \frac{1}{2}$ minutes. Well balanced program: Rule 7520

O. Open Masters: A team of 8 to 16 skaters. Skaters must be at least 25, and the majority of the team must

be at least 30.

Program duration: 2 ½ minutes. Well balanced program: Rule 7530

P. Masters: A team of 12 to 20 skaters. Skaters must be at least 25, and the majority of the team must

be at least 30.

Program duration: 3 minutes. Well balanced program: Rule 7510

Q. Adult: A team of 12 to 20 skaters. All skaters must be at least 21 with the exception that up to four

team members may be 18, 19 or 20 years of age. All skaters must have passed either the preliminary moves in the field test, the adult bronze moves in the field test, the preliminary

figure test or the preliminary dance test. Program duration: 3 minutes 15 seconds

Crossover Rules:

No team may be comprised of more than 50% of athletes that are also on any other team. This applies to both the entire roster and the athletes that are skating on the ice at any given competition.

The chart below illustrates the levels where crossover skaters are allowed. The shaded areas indicate no crossovers are allowed. An "X" indicates crossovers are allowed between the two levels, providing all requirements are met as defined Rules 7200 – 7530, in addition to the statement above.
