The Autumn Synchro Classic is a part of the 2019-2020 Midwestern Synchronized Skating Challenge Series

The 2019 Autumn Synchronized Skating Classic will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current Rulebook as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted of the U.S. Figure Skating web site.

This competition is open to all synchronized teams comprised of members who are eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and currently registered members of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current Rulebook. Refer to the current rule book for non-U.S. Citizens.

This event is proud to participate in the 2019-2020 National Synchronized Skating Challenge Series. Participation in this series is open to all Snowplow Sam Synchro, Synchro Skills 1, 2, or 3 teams and preliminary, pre-juvenile, open juvenile, open collegiate and open adult teams. Visit www.usfigureskating.org for more information on this series. Results of this event for participating teams will be reported to U.S. Figure Skating for calculation of the series results.

ELIGIBILITY / TEST AND AGE REQUIREMENTS: Skaters must meet the age requirements by the July 1st preceding this competition. This competition is not requiring that Moves in the Field test requirements be met, with the exception of the maximum allowed at the Learn to Skate USA level.

ENTRIES: All applications must be received by: **October 20, 2019.** Synchro Skills 1-3 and Snowplow Sam Synchro events should be run in accordance to the Learn to Skate USA Competition Manual (a maximum of 6 teams per group). http://comp.entryeeze.com/Home.aspx?cid=328

For Synchro Skills 1-3, if a team fits into one level age-wise, but would like more of a challenge, they should be able to "skate-up" one level (for example, team has majority of skaters under 9 years old but would like to skate in Synchro Skills 2, they should be allowed).



The entry fee is \$125 per event plus \$20 per competitor, including alternates. The entry fee for all Synchro Skills levels is \$50 per team and \$5 per skater.

An online entry system with secure credit card payment is being used for the competition.

All registration will be done online through Entryeeze. Entries must be registered by midnight October 20, 2019 Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the local organizing

REFUND POLICY:

Entry fees will not be refunded after October 20, 2019 unless no competition exists or is canceled. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be assessed a \$25 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the team is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

"LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS: This event will follow the Locker Rooms and Changing Area policy included in the SafeSport Handbook."

MUSIC: The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in. A duplicate CD should be readily available. Music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but the RecPlex Ice Arena and Cutting Edge FSC cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. **PLEASE HAVE SEPARATE CDs FOR PRACTICE AND COMPETITION.**

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating and RecPlex Ice Arena accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

JUDGING SYSTEM: The 6.0 Judging System will be used for ALL Events

REGISTRATION: The registration desk will be maintained in the RecPlex Ice Arena lobby area. The coach for each team must register and pick up their team packet.

- The registration desk will be open during practice ice sessions and during the competition until approximately one hour after the competition concludes.
- Teams should register at least two hours before their scheduled locker room entry.
- Coaches, team managers, and team service personnel must check in at registration with their proper USFS/PSA identification. All coaches MUST have their registration/I.D. lanyard on them to accompany their team to the ice.
- At registration teams will submit 1 CD.

ADMISSION: Each team will receive credentials for each skater, two coaches and two chaperones. These credentials will be included in your team packet received at registration. All other individuals accompanying a team will be allowed to watch at no charge but will not be allowed past designated areas.



In order to receive a chaperone credential, each team manager and team service personnel must have completed the SafeSport Training and successfully passed a background check. Those that cannot produce proof that these have been successfully completed will not be provided a chaperone credential.

Team managers and team service personnel will be asked to pick up their own credentials. These credentials are only to be used by the team manager and team service personnel who originally picked them up and may not be shared. Anyone found using a credential, not on the approved compliance list, will have their credential privileges revoked for the duration of the competition and be brought to the attention of U.S. Figure Skating and the Ethics Committee.

In order to receive a chaperone credential, each team manager and team service personnel must have completed the SafeSport Training and successfully passed a background check. Those that cannot produce proof that these have been successfully completed will not be provided a chaperone credential.

AWARDS: The top **FOUR** placements in each division will receive medals. Divisions with twelve or more entries will be divided into two (2) final flights. The top four teams in each flight will receive medals. Awards may be picked up at the Results table.

INFORMATION REGARDING ALL COACHES:

To coach at a U.S. Figure Skating nonqualifying competition, a professional coach or choreographer must be:

- ✓ Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating- either through a member club or as an individual member.
- ✓ If 18 years of age or older, must submit the proper payment of \$20 through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only website, and submit information for and successfully pass an annual background check.
- ✓ Must complete the CER SafeSport training course and any additional courses as required in MR 5.12 effective starting July 1, 2019.
- ✓ Must submit proof of general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential. Coaches who are NOT on the list will need to show proof of membership in U.S. Figure Skating, proof of compliance, proof of safesport compliance and a photo I.D. at check in. If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions. We strongly urge all coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions

Foreign coaches will be required to present the LOC with a letter, from their Federation, verifying they are a member in good standing.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: Any official notices or changes will be sent via email or posted on the Entryeeze website. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent, and/or coach to check this site frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.
