## Entry Deadline: 11:59 PM, PST April 28, 2019 Registration is ONLINE ONLY

Ice Fest 2019 will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating or Skate Canada member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

## NATIONAL QUALIFING SERIES EVENT INFORMATION

This competition has been approved by U.S. Figure Skating as an official NQS event. Athletes are required to read the <u>NQS handbook</u> and register for the series through EMS by May 28<sup>th</sup> (separate from competition registration).

## NATIONAL SOLO DANCE SERIES EVENT INFORMATION

The Solo Pattern Dance event, Combined Event, and Shadow Dance events are being offered as part of the U.S. Figure Skating Solo Dance Series. Events will run in accordance with the <u>2019 U.S. Figure Skating Solo Dance Series Handbook</u>. All skaters, regardless of participation in the NSDS series, may enter these events.

## ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

**Test level**: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event.

Age restrictions/requirements: Singles free skate events have the following requirements.

Juvenile: Girls – 12 years or younger; Boys – 13 years or younger Open Juvenile: Ladies – 13 years or older; Men – 14 years or older Intermediate Men and Ladies must be under the age of 18 Adult Men and Ladies must be 21 years or older

Skaters entering Non-Test through Pre-Juvenile events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group. Events may be combined boys/girls at the discretion of the Chief Referee (in accordance with US Figure Skating rules).

**NQS REMINDER:** All NQS events are combined short program and free skate events. If there are more than 24 entries per event, qualifying rounds must be held in accordance with Rule 2460. SEE THE <u>NQS LOC HANDBOOK</u> FOR DETAILS (p. 5 - 7).



**ENTRIES:** Online entry with secure credit card payment is available via <u>usfsaonline.org</u> for Qualifying level Singles and Pairs events and via <u>EntryEeze.com</u> for ALL OTHER events. **Registration is ONLINE ONLY and must be completed by 11:59 PM PST on April 28, 2019.** Practice and Competition schedules will be available on the website approximately two weeks before the competition. It is essential that a current email address is available to the LOC as announcements for competitors will be emailed via the EMS system OR Entryeeze portal, when possible.

Showcase entries must indicate both the entrant's Singles Free Skating test level and their Pattern Dance Test level to ensure placement in the correct showcase level in accordance with current U.S. Figure Skating guidelines.

**FEES**: The following table indicates the fee structure for the 2019 Ice Fest Competition. Fees are determined by the number and type of events entered. If a skater enters only one event, pricing is indicated in the First Event column. If a skater enters multiple events, the first event is priced using the First Event column and subsequent events are priced using the Second Event column. Please note that certain events are only priced at First Event rates and do not qualify for Second Event pricing.

#### FOREIGN SKATERS:

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for Qualifying level in Singles or Pairs events, this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition. This can be done by choosing the "Non-Member? Create Account" option on the <u>Members Only</u> login page.

#### PARTNERED EVENTS

For Qualifying level Pairs events, only one partner needs to complete registration for the team in EMS. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/ppc upload, practice ice sales, etc.

For all other partnered events, both skaters need to complete their own registration in EntryEeze.

Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee and the Local Organizing Committee and will be subject to a \$30 late entry fee. No entries will be accepted after the draw has been completed.

## **EMS SKATER PORTAL:**

Once online registration has been completed, skaters will gain access to the EMS Skater Portal for this competition. This is where you will manage music and PPC upload as well as purchase practice ice, view the competition schedule (once available) and update coach information. To access your skater portal, click the **BLUE** Event Management System button on the <u>Members</u> <u>Only</u> landing page then select the competition name from options at the bottom of the screen.

#### ENTRYEEZE PORTAL:

Once online registration has been completed, skaters will gain access to the EntryEeze Portal for this competition via their skater account. This is where you will manage music and PPC



upload as well as purchase practice ice, view the competition schedule (once available) and update coach information.

**REFUND POLICY:** Entry fees will not be refunded after the entry deadline unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$30 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

**FACILITIES:** Ice Fest is hosted by the Seattle Skating Club and will be held at the Olympicview Arena, 22202 70th Ave. West, Mountlake Terrace, WA 98043. The ice surface is indoors, measures 100' X 200', with slightly rounded corners. More information on the rink can be found at <u>www.olympicviewarena.com</u>. The competition facility features locker room space (minimally 3), a café, and a pro shop.

Some events will be held at the Lynnwood Ice Center, 19803 68<sup>th</sup> Avenue W, Lynnwood, WA 98036. The Lynnwood Ice Center ice surface is indoors, measures 85' X 200', with slightly rounded corners. More information on the rink can be found at <u>www.lynnwoodicecenter.com</u>. The competition facility features locker room space (minimally 3), a café.

#### Music can be uploaded until May 05, 2019 11:59 PM with \$30 late fee.

All competition music must be electronically submitted online through the Music & Program Content tab no later than **April 28, 2019, 11:59 PM**. All music must meet the following criteria. ## MUSIC CRITERIA:

- File Format: MP3 (only format EMS will accept)
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps or higher and Sample Rate: 44,100 kHz
  - This will be verified by the music chair and they may request you upload a corrected file
- Leaders and trailers (the silence or "dead space" before and after the actual start and end of the program music) may not exceed two (2) seconds. We prefer that there be NO leaders or trailers at all. Excessive leaders and trailers may disrupt the playing of the music during competition.

Competitors must also bring a copy of their competition music on CD as a backup in case of technical difficulties and must be available rink side during the competition. Only CDs (standard CD-R format only) will be accepted for backups and must be clearly marked with the competitor's name, event, and running time.

**LIABILITY**: U.S. Figure Skating, Seattle Skating Club, and Olympicview Arena, Lynnwood Ice Center or Washington Ice Skating Association accepts no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.



# <u>JUDGING SYSTEM</u>: The International Judging System (IJS) under Rule 1070 will be used for the following events:

- Well Balanced Program Singles Freeskating (Short Program and Freeskating) Intermediate through Senior
- Well Balanced Program Singles Freeskating (Freeskating only) Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile/Open Juvenile, Juvenile SP ONLY (Non-NQS Event)
- Pairs Freeskating (Short Program and Freeskating) Novice through Senior
- Pairs Freeskating (Freeskating only) No Test through Intermediate
- Couples Ice Dancing (Pattern Dance and Free Dance) Pre-Juvenile through Novice
- Couples Ice Dancing (Rhythm Dance and Free Dance) Junior and Senior
- Couples Ice Dancing (Pro/Am and Am/Am Partnered Pattern Dance) Bronze through International
- National Solo Dance Series Events
- Pre-Preliminary Preliminary Singles FS may choose IJS or 6.0. Skaters may not register for both 6.0 and IJS events at the same level. For example, they must pick between Preliminary free skate 6.0 or Preliminary free skate IJS.

All competitors skating in these IJS events need to submit the planned program content online Skater Portal no later than May 21, 2019 11:59 PM. A \$30 fee will be charged for late PPCs.

## The 6.0 Majority Judging System under Rule 1060 will be used for all other events:

- Well Balanced Program free skate events: No-Test, Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary
- No-Test Pairs Free Skate Events
- Excel Singles Freeskating (Short Program and Freeskating) Intermediate through Senior
- Excel Singles Freeskating (Freeskating Only) Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile/Open Juvenile
- Showcase and Ensemble events
- Compete USA Events
- All interpretive events
- Couples Free Dance No Test and Preliminary
- Couples Ice Dancing (Pro/Am and Am/Am Partnered Pattern Dance) Preliminary and Pre-Bronze
- Pre-Preliminary Preliminary Singles FS may choose IJS or 6.0. Skaters may not register for both 6.0 and IJS events at the same level. For example, they must pick between Preliminary Free Skate 6.0 or Preliminary free skate IJS.

# The Chief Referee reserves the right to use the 6.0 system for any event for which IJS qualified officials are not available.

**<u>REGISTRATION</u>**: Registration will begin on Thursday, May 30, one hour before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration desk will be located in the rink lobby. Please register promptly upon arrival.

**OFFICIAL NOTICES:** An official bulletin board will be maintained on site. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. The schedule of events will be posted at registration prior to the competition.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS: Please click here to review the Locker Rooms



and Changing Area policy. More detailed information can be found in the SafeSport Handbook.

Minimum four locker rooms will be made available for athlete use:

- Girls under age 11 (Same gender parent is allowed in locker room to assist skater, if needed)
- Girls and Ladies over 11 (Parents not allowed)
- Boys under age 11 (Same gender parent is allowed in locker room to assist skater, if needed)
- Boys and Men over 11 (Parents not allowed)
- NOTE: No audio or visual recording devises are permitted in locker room. This includes but is not limited to cell phones with cameras or recording capability, tablets, cameras, laptops, etc. Anything that connects to the internet or that could take a picture or record is prohibited and may be confiscated. This rule is for the protection of the athletes.
- NOTE: Locker rooms are for the use of the athletes preparing to enter the ice for practice or for an event. Locker rooms are not for the long term storage of costumes or equipment.
- NOTE: Restrooms are not to be used as changing areas. It is strongly recommended that skaters who need assistance changing arrive at the competition facility fully dressed in competition attire

<u>PRACTICE ICE:</u> Practice Ice shall be scheduled through EMS for all events. Each competitor may request one \$20.00/30min practice session per event entered (excluding interpretive events) for individual events, and two practice sessions per combined event. Skaters will be able to pick their own practice ice sessions online, but you MUST indicate number of sessions you want online when you register and MUST pay for them when you register online. You will receive an email with instructions on choosing practice ice time after the schedule has been set. Every effort will be made to schedule Practice ice sessions as close to the competition as possible, however this is not guaranteed.

NOTE: Depending on the size of the competition, practice ice selection might be limited to one or two time choices.

Practice Ice not pre-ordered will be sold on a first come-first serve basis, but we cannot guarantee additional practice sessions. If space permits, we will allow additional practice ice sales online for \$25.00/30 minutes per session after the schedule has been posted and those that pre-registered for sessions have had time to select their sessions. If space permits, additional practice ice will be available for purchase during the competition for \$25.00/30 minutes at the registration desk with cash or check only.

*No Changes - No Refunds.* Practice ice fees are nonrefundable, and you may not assign your Opractice ice to another skater.

*Practice Ice Schedules* will not be given over the phone but will be available online when available.

**PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY**: A professional video company and photographer will be at the rink. Any other professional photography/videography is prohibited. ALL award winners are encouraged to pose for the group picture. All other videotaping and photography is restricted to hand-held battery-operated equipment, without tripod, and is permissible only in the upper viewing area. No videotaping or photography from rink side. Videotaping or photography of any skater other than your own is strictly prohibited. Please be courteous to those viewing the event. Solicitation by any photographer or agent of anyone to be the subject of still or video



photography is not permitted. For safety reasons, **no flash photography is allowed during the** event.

**AWARDS:** Individual events are separate and considered final rounds. Combined event overall placements will be determined by the combination of results from the initial and final rounds. Awards will be presented at the photographer's table immediately after the official posting of each event for individual events. For combined events, awards will be presented after each event segment, in addition to the overall combined final placement. Awards will be given for first through sixth place for all events. Award Photographs will be taken and we ask that all award winners pose for the group picture even if you do not plan on purchasing a picture.

Compete USA events will have no more than six skaters per group and all will receive an award.

**Special Awards** to be presented at the completion of the appropriate events. The perpetual trophies will remain in the SSC showcase, engraved with the skater's name. The winning skater shall also receive a personal award from the Seattle Skating Club.

Awards placement for the "Special Awards" shall be determined by the event judges.

- Rosalynn Sumners Seattle Skating Club "Artistic Award" Awarded to an Intermediate and above skater for exceptional Artistic Performance as determined by the event judges.
- The Shirle Irene Lander Trophy Awarded to a Juvenile and below skater for exceptional Artistic Performance as determined by the event judges.
- "The Hadley Award" This shall be awarded to a skater of any level who demonstrates excellence in both artistic and free skating and also represents the spirit of figure skating at the Ice Fest Event as determined by the event judges. Seattle Skating Club members, Ila Rae & Ray Hadley, were the 1960 US Silver Pairs Champions & 1957 Junior Pairs National Champions. They, along with their coach and mother Linda Hadley, perished with the other members of the 1961 U.S. World Team when their plane crashed en route to the World Championships. This special award is made in their name.

**TEST CREDIT:** Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit may request their test credit forms at registration. Forms must be picked up at the registration desk prior to the end of the competition. Forms must be requested 24 hours before your event start time.

## **INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES:**

To be a credentialed coach at a sanctioned nonqualifying competition, coaches must be included within a skater's registration or updated through their EMS Skater Portal. All coach compliance is verified via EMS and is connected to the U.S. Figure Skating database.

- A. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member;
- B. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.
- C. Must Complete Safe Sport Training.
- D. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A, B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.
- E. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.



\*SafeSport training is available through <u>http://www.usfsaonline.org</u> for full members of U.S. Figure Skating (through Learn to Skate USA portal for instructors). There is no cost to this training and certification is valid for 2 seasons

The LOC will have a list of compliant coaches via EMS verified through the U.S. Figure Skating database who are approved to receive a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential. There can be <u>no exceptions</u> to this policy. We strongly urge *all* coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without proper registration is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

**OFFICIALS**: Competition officials will be selected in accordance with Rule 3030, except that officials for basic skills events will be selected in accordance with Rule 3120.

**REFEREE:** The decision of the Referee on all matters will be final. The Referee, along with the LOC, shall have the right to exclude any person(s) whose behavior is unruly or unsportsmanlike. Additionally, the Referee reserves the right to combine or split events to best accommodate the number of entries and schedule of events.

## Allowance for Skate Canada requirements in U.S. Figure Skating Events

In general, Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile freeskating events, and Intermediate through Novice short program and freeskating events will be judged in accordance with the time and content requirements and restrictions specified in the current US Figure Skating rulebook.

It is preferred that Canadian entrants in these events review the time and element content of their programs against the US Figure Skating time and content requirements and restrictions and adjust their programs as necessary to ensure full credit for elements completed. However, because of the many differences between the US Figure Skating and Skate Canada time and content requirements and restrictions for the 2020 season, Canadian entrants will be allowed to skate their programs as choreographed under Skate Canada rules, subject to the technical and judging evaluation conditions outlined below:

Pre Juvenile Freeskating

A spiral sequence will be accepted and evaluated as a Level Base step sequence.

The US Figure Skating time requirement of 2:00 ± 10-seconds will be enforced.

Juvenile Freeskating

All element content completed within the Canadian time requirement of  $2:30 \pm 10$ -seconds will be evaluated without time penalty.

A step sequence utilizing one-half the ice surface will be accepted and evaluated as a choreographic step sequence.

The US Figure Skating requirements for minimum spin revolutions in position will be enforced.

Intermediate Short Program

All element content completed within the Canadian time requirement of  $2:20 \pm 10$ -seconds will be evaluated without time penalty.

The US Figure Skating requirements for minimum spin revolutions in position will be enforced, except as noted below for Intermediate Men Short Program.

Intermediate Men Short Program

A change-foot sit spin of four revolutions minimum on each foot will be accepted as fulfilling the spin-in-one-position element.

If held, the qualifying round will consist of a free skate only, with the appropriate number of athletes advancing to the championship round. The championship round will consist of a combined short program and free skate competition, resulting in a final Total Score (intermediate – senior) or a championship free skate only Total Score (juvenile). (In competitions where there are 24 or fewer entries, there is no qualifying round and all skaters are considered to be competing in the championship round).

The skater's <u>Total Score (TS) from the competition will be the combined short program and free</u> <u>skate score in the championship round</u> (intermediate – senior) or free skate score in the championship round (juvenile). Scores earned in the qualifying round of an NQS event are not considered in the current standings for the NQS.

**Consolation Rounds:** If qualifying rounds are necessary for intermediate and higher, a consolation round is held for competitors that do not qualify for the championship round. Consolation rounds include the short program only and are under the jurisdiction of the host competition; scores from consolation rounds are not transmitted to U.S. Figure Skating. The purpose of the consolation round is so all competitors can compete their short program.

## PAIRS EVENTS

Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile pairs events are separate and considered final rounds. Intermediate – Senior events will consist of both short and long programs. Combined results will be considered final – there will be no final rounds even if numbers warrant more than group per event.

The points awarded in the combined event will be based upon the skaters' combined overall point total from the pattern or short dance (depending on the level entered) and the free dance.
