General Information

Eligibility

All competitors must be members in good standing of a club having membership in U.S. Figure Skating. A competitor may also enter as an individual member of U.S. Figure Skating or as a member of a probationary club. Skaters may compete in as many disciplines as qualified by test level and age but may compete in only one event per discipline. Disciplines refer to the following events: Free Skating, Compulsory Moves, Spins, Pairs, Free Dance, Solo Free Dance Dramatic Entertainment and Light Entertainment. Skaters may compete in as many Couples Dance events and Solo Pattern Dance events as qualified by test level. Age and test classifications are as of the close of entries.

Judging System

IJS will be used for these Men's and Ladies' Free Skating events: Adult Masters Jr/Sr; Adult Masters Int/Nov; Adult Gold; Adult Silver. All remaining events will be judged under the 6.0 System.

Except as stated herein, the competition will be conducted according to the rules set forth in the 2018-2019 Official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

Entries

Entry is through EntryEeze only. Registration closes at 11:59 PM EDT on **Thursday, January 17, 2019**. A limited late registration period may be offered at the discretion of the Local Organizing Committee (LOC). Refund of entry fee, not processing fee, will be granted if an event is eliminated.

Entry Fees

- For first event, \$155 for IJS event or \$110 for 6.0 free skate, entertainment or solo dance event;
- \$60 per second & subsequent singles, interpretive event;
- \$120 total for each Free Dance event; each partner must register;
- \$80 total for each Partnered Pattern Dance; each partner must register;
- \$75 total for "Don't Go It Alone" or Team Event; one member pays and provides a roster.

Entry fees reserve time on the schedule and competition resources. Entry fees include the cost of video. There will be no refunds for injury or illness.

Age Classes

There will be age classes for all free skate, dramatic entertainment and light entertainment events (does not include pair or partnered or solo dance events).

Class I: 21 to 35 years

Class III: 46 to 55 years

Class II: 36 to 45 years

Class IV: 56 years to 65 years

Class V: 66 years and above

At the discretion of the Chief Referee, age groups may be combined to form events of 3 or more entries. Women and men will be combined in Entertainment, Spins, Solo Dance and Solo Free Dance events.

Awards

Awards will be presented to the first, second, and third place winners in each event. Awards not collected by the close of the registration desk will be forfeited.

Liability

U.S. Figure Skating, Washington Figure Skating Club, and the Local Organizing Committee undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters or officials. As a condition of and in consideration of the acceptance of their entries or participation therein, all entrants and officials shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks of injury to their person and property resulting from, caused by, or connected with, the conduct and management of the competition, and to waive and release any and all claims which they may have against any officials, U.S. Figure Skating, WFSC, and against its and their officers, and their entries shall be accepted only on such condition.

Music

CD's will be preferred. CD's must only have one track. Skaters should have a spare CD nearby during their performance.

Instead of CD's, a USB thumb drives is acceptable. It should also have only one track and a backup must be available during performance.

Because of various issues with 1/8" earphone connection issues, password issues and shutdowns, WFSC strongly discourages using smartphones for music.

Rink

Prince William Ice Center has two rink surfaces with rounded corners and hockey barriers. One surface is 200' by 85' (NHL) and the other is 200' by 100' (Olympic). This year the competition events will be held on the NHL surface.

Coaches must have a valid ID and be fully compliant with U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11.

Schedule and Practice Ice The schedule of events and practice ice will be posted on the New Year's Invitational EntryEeze website. The final schedule will be available at the competition and skaters must check for updates both at the New Year's Invitational EntryEeze website and at the competition.

Any event may be held on either Saturday afternoon/evening or Sunday morning/afternoon. The schedule will not be available until after close of entries.

Composition of Events

FREE SKATING EVENTS

Eligibility and well-balanced program requirements must be in accordance with the 2018-19 U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook, see section 6500 for Test Qualifications and Program requirements. Skaters in IJS-judged events must enter their Planned Program Content Sheet (PPCS) on the EntryEeze website. Each skater may only enter one free skating event.

Masters Junior-Senior (IJS; Music not to exceed 3:40). Must meet the qualifications for Championship Masters Junior-Senior Free Skate event.

Masters Intermediate-Novice (IJS; Music not to exceed 3:10). Must meet the qualifications for Championship Masters Intermediate-Novice Free Skate event or Adult Gold Free Skate event.

Gold (IJS; Music not to exceed 2:40). Must meet the qualifications for Adult Gold Free Skate event or Adult Silver Free Skate event.

Silver (IJS; Music not to exceed 2:10). Must meet the qualifications for Adult Silver or Adult Bronze Free Skate event.

Bronze & Pre Bronze (6.0; Music not to exceed 1:40) Defined in the Adult Competition Series description later in this announcement. FS event may be entered independently without ACS participation.

COUPLES DANCE EVENTS

Partnered Pattern Dances (from the current season). Teams qualified for Adult Pre-Gold Dance or above may not enter Pre-Silver or lower dances. 6.0 judging system. Music will be skaters' choice with regulations according to the following website:

Partnered Free Dance Team must qualify for Adult Pre-Gold Dance or higher. See the 2018-19 Official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook section 8500 for the Adult Free Dance description and elements. Music not to exceed 3:10.

Each member of the dance team must separately register on EntryEeze.

SOLO PATTERN DANCE EVENTS

Solo Pattern Dance Skaters may enter more than one level provided they are qualified. Test qualifications for Solo Pattern Dance events are defined in the 2018-19 USFS Rulebook, see section 8610. Music: skaters have the option of providing their own music, see rule 8031(B).

Bronze Solo: Cha Cha, Hickory Hoedown
Pre-Silver Solo: Hickory Hoedown, Foxtrot
Silver Solo: European Waltz, Rocker Foxtrot
Pre-Gold Solo: Tango, Kilian
Gold Solo: Blues, Quickstep

Solo Free Dance Test qualifications and element requirements for Solo Free Dance events are defined in the 2018-19 USFS Rulebook, see sections 8700. Music: skaters must provide their own music.

Bronze Element requirements are listed in 8741. Music 1:40, + or - :10
Silver Element requirements are listed in 8721. Music 2:00, + or - :10
Gold Element requirements are listed in 8701. Music 2:40, + or - :10

ENTERTAINMENT EVENTS

Levels are the same as Freestyle in this announcement. Program rules for singles events are as described in <http://www.usfigureskating.org/content/2019%20Showcase%20Guidelines.pdf>. Music not to exceed 1:40 for Bronze, Silver and Gold levels and not to exceed 2:10 for Masters level.

“Don’t Go It Alone”

This is an entertainment event for two or three skaters, no Axel/no double jumps and no overhead lifts. Props may be carried or placed on the ice. Event may be separated into Duets and Trios if 3 or more teams enter each type. Music not to exceed 2:10.

SPIN EVENTS

Spins will be performed on a half-ice surface without music. Connecting steps with half-revolution jumps are permitted. Each spin must have at least 3 revolutions per foot. Open combination spins are unrestricted as to number of foot changes and positions. Spins may be skated in any order.

Levels - same as Free Skate in this announcement. Music not to exceed 1:20 for all levels.

Masters

- Camel change foot camel spin, transition and variations optional
- Back upright, layback or scratch spin, edge entry
- Open combination spin

Gold

- Flying camel spin, variations optional
- Forward upright, layback or scratch spin
- Open combination spin

Silver

- Sit, broken leg or intermediate position spin
- Layback or side leaning spin, variations optional
- Open combination spin

Bronze

- Camel spin
- Upright or scratch spin with change of foot

- Combination spin with at least 2 positions, change of foot optional

Pre Bronze

- Forward upright spin
- Two foot spin
- Intermediate or sit position spin, variations optional

COMPULSORY MOVES EVENTS

Compulsory Moves will be skated on a half-ice surface without music. Elements may be skated in any order. Spins need a minimum of 2 revolutions in position to be judged and variations permitted within the designated position. Levels are same as Freestyle in this announcement. Time not to exceed 1:20 for all levels

For Adult 1 through Bronze levels, see the Adult Competition Series section.

Masters

- Choice of any double jump
- Jump combination that may include any other double jump or single jump
- Solo spin of skater's choice
- Straight line step sequence

Adult Gold

- Single Lutz or Axel
- Jump combination (single/single or single/double, any order, Lutz or Axel may not be repeated)
- Camel spin
- Straight line step sequence

Adult Silver

- Single loop
- Single/single jump combination (loop may not be repeated)
- Sit spin
- Straight line step sequence

Bronze and Pre Bronze Compulsory Moves are offered see the Adult Competition Series for the required elements and may be entered independently without ACS participation.

TEAM EVENT

Team consists of 3 to 5 members. No team member may perform more than 2 of the below elements. A skater may compete on only one team. For each masters level skater on the team, there must be a bronze or lower level skater on the team. One team member must enter, pay and provide a roster on EntryEeze.

Each team will have one member complete each of the following elements:

- 1) Half ice step sequence to a Single Axel
- 2) Camel spin, optional: fly, change foot, camel variations
- 3) Spiral (on any single edge) held to complete a circle
- 4) 2 or 3-jump sequence that includes a flip jump
- 5) Scratch spin

2018-19 ADULT COMPETITION SERIES (Adult 1 – Adult Bronze):

Adult 1 through Adult Bronze levels at the 2019 NYI will be a part of the inaugural Eastern Adult Competition Series. Skaters participating in the Sectional Series accumulate points based upon placement in the Free Skate and Compulsory Moves events that will be used to determine the final series placements within the Eastern Section. Series awards will be presented at the 2018 Eastern Adult Sectional Nonqualifying Competition held in conjunction with the Eastern Adult Sectionals Championships in Havertown, Pennsylvania from March 8-10, 2019.

In addition to the competition entry fee(s), skaters wishing to participate in the 2018-19 Adult Competition Series must complete the registration form prior to December 30, 2018 and pay the \$20.00 participation fee. Skaters may enter these events at the NYI without registering for the ACS.

Adult 1 – Adult Bronze: COMPULSORY & PROGRAM/FREE SKATE EVENTS

The Compulsory event comprises required elements at each level. A random draw will be held to determine the starting order. This event is offered at the Adult 1 through Adult Bronze levels.

The Program/Free Skate comprises standardized elements at each level. A random draw will be held to determine the starting order. This event is offered at the Adult 1 through Adult Bronze levels.

Points will be awarded to each skater based on the skaters' placement in the event. (Refer to page 10, Awarding of Points.)

1) COMPULSORY AND PROGRAM/FREE SKATE EVENT:

All skaters must either compete at their test level or one level above of their highest completed Learn to Skate USA Adult class level or U.S. Figure Skating test passed as of the close of entries of the competition. Skaters must enter the Compulsory **AND** the Program/Free Skate event at the same level in each competition.

Skaters may move up levels in the 2018-19 Series and receive "Move Up Points" – see Awarding of Points section for more information. The skater's points will follow them to the next level.

Test level may be either standard, adult, masters. See progression chart below for crossover from standard track.

3) Adult 1 – Adult Bronze: COMPULSORY MOVES REQUIREMENTS:

Compulsory moves will be awarded one mark. The mark shall be for the technical score.

General event parameters:

- The skating order of the elements is optional.
- Element may only be attempted once
- To be skated in program format with limited connecting steps
- To be skated on ½ ice
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element MISSING, REPEATED or FROM A HIGHER LEVEL

4) Adult 1 – Adult Bronze: PROGRAM / FREE SKATE REQUIREMENTS:

Program/Free Skate events will be awarded two marks. The first mark shall be for the technical score. The second mark shall be for program components.

General event parameters:

- The skating order of the required elements is optional.
- The elements are not restricted to the number of times element is executed, or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise stated. Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program.

- The minimum number of required spin revolutions is indicated in parentheses following the spin description. Revolutions must be in position.
- Vocal music is allowed
- To be skated on full ice
- For Adult 1-6, the skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use, but is not required to use, any additional elements from previous (lower) levels.
