## U.S. FIGURE SKATING IJS PROTOCOL for TEST CREDIT – INFORMATION OVERVIEW (ATHLETES, COACHES, TEST CHAIRS, COMPETITION CHAIRS)

In accordance with Rules TR 3.00, 4.01 and 4.02, athletes may receive credit for meeting minimum scores at any competition held under the International Judge System (IJS). The athlete must "skate-up" to the event they are seeking test credit for, in addition to having already passed any prerequisites prior to the competition event.

#### **Events eligible:**

Singles Free Skate: Open Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior, Senior and Adult Gold

<u>Pairs Free Skate</u>: Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior <u>Free Dance</u>: Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior

#### FOR ATHLETES

### YOU ACHIEVED THE MINIMUM SCORES FOR RECEIVING TEST CREDIT FOR A COMPETITION EVENT YOU "SKATED UP" IN. WHAT DO YOU DO?

**STEP 1:** At the competition, go to the registration/information desk and ask for a "**Test Credit Packet**" which includes the documents listed below. This <u>MUST</u> be requested on-site, and will not be available after the competition ends. Take a picture of all documents for safe-keeping. As a courtesy, ask the competition for the packet within one hour of your event ending.

Documents needed / included in the Test Credit Packet:

- 1. A copy of the overall event results, that lists all of the skaters, in addition to the names of the Technical Controller and Event Referee. This is to prove the skater actually skated in the event.
- 2. Your individual protocol
- 3. Your **Test Credit Skater Report**, generated by the accountant. This has your name, your scores and verifies you achieved a passing result. See the next page for an example.

**STEP 2:** Obtain a written statement from your coach verifying that the above documents are true and valid. The coach may write their own statement, they may choose to use the sample document included in this packet, or your club may have a pre-printed form they can simply sign.

**STEP 3:** Submit these documents to your club's Test Chair, along with the appropriate payment and request that the club record your test through the Members Only program, <a href="https://www.usfsaonline.org">www.usfsaonline.org</a>

Each club may request this information in their preferred format. (For example, scan or upload picture files of the documentation to an online form, or submit paper copies, etc.). The important thing is that your club's test chair obtains copies of documents 1-3, in step 1 and verification from your coach that it is authentic.

**IMPORTANT:** Before you leave the competition, check your packet and be sure you have ALL three of the correct documents. If you do not, please ask to speak with the Accountant to obtain them.



### **FOR COACHES**

In accordance with TR 4.00, in order for an athlete to receive test credit for IJS protocol, their coach must verify in writing, that the documents provided are correct and unaltered. Coaches may fill out this form, write their own supporting statement, or simply sign a test form created by a club with the statement pre-printed on it.

Please deliver a copy of this form (or statement) to the Test Chair of the Home Club of the test candidate, via the preferred method of the club (i.e., email, upload to a web site, paper, etc.)

## IJS Protocol for Test Credit – Fact Sheet

In order to be eligible to receive Test Credit through a non-qualifying competition, the candidate:

- 1. Must have met the prerequisites for that test, as of the date of the competition.
- 2. Must "skate up" and compete in the level they are wishing to "pass."
- 3. If competing in the qualifying system, <u>may not</u> use a competition between the close of entries for Regionals / Sectionals and their last qualifying event.

**Example:** A skater wishes to receive credit for the Intermediate FS test by competing in a non-qualifying competition held December 1<sup>st</sup>. He/she must have passed a) the Intermediate MITF test AND the Juvenile FS test prior, and enter the Intermediate FS portion of the competition.

If this skater had qualified for the U.S. Championships in Juvenile, he/she would <u>not</u> be eligible to use the December 1<sup>st</sup> competition for test credit, since his/her qualifying competitive season as a Juvenile would not have ended yet. (A skater that didn't advance would be eligible.)



### IJS Protocol for Test Credit – Fact Sheet

The candidate is eligible, achieved the minimum scores and wants test credit – how does it work?

- 1. When results are posted, the accountant will generate a list of all skaters in the particular event that achieved the minimum scores.
- 2. The skater obtains a copy of this list, in addition to:
  - a) The overall event results with the signature of the Event Referee and the Technical Controller.
  - b) Their individual protocol sheet.
  - c) A note from their coach verifying these results are valid.
- 3. The skater submits these documents to their Test Chair, along with the appropriate fees, within 365 days of the competition.
- 4. The Test Chair enters the information through the Members Only site, officially "passing" the test, just as they would at a test session.

## IJS Protocol for Test Credit – Minimum Scores

Skaters must achieve ALL THREE minimums for their level, in addition to no "no value" elements, represented by " - - - " on the protocol where judges' scores should be. Example –a Novice Ladies' Free Skate, where the minimums are: TSS = 37.00 TES = 14.2 PCS = 22.8
