

Fiesta Skate 2023 Sno-King Kirkland Ice Arena In-House Competition and Exhibition March 25, 2023

COMPETITION

Sno-King Kirkland Ice Arena's annual "Fiesta Skate" In-House competition/Exhibition will be held on March 25, 2023. The competition is a non-qualifying U.S. Figure Skating In-house and is sanctioned by Learn to Skate USA. This competition will be governed by the current Compete USA manual.

ENTRIES

Entries and Fee's must be completed via Entryeeze registration on-line. Entries must be Completed and <u>Received by March 1, 2023.</u> (Registration link to be distributed among members upon competition approval). Group ensembles are to register through the skating director by Team Coach by March 1, 2023. Practice Ice shall be scheduled through Entryeeze for all events.

ELIGIBILITY AND TEST REQUIREMENTS

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All **Snowplow Sam and Basic 1-6** skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed, including Moves in the Field or individual dances.

For the Pre-Free Skate, Free Skate 1-6, Excel, Well-Balanced and Adult, eligibility will be based only upon highest badge level or free skate test level passed.

Moves in the Field test level will not determine skater's competitive level. Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher, but not both levels in the same event during the same competition. Skaters may not compete at more than one level in the same type of event at the same competition.

It is very important to the success of the com- petition that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the local organizing committee (LOC) discovers that a skater has been placed in a category below his/her badge or test level, the chair and referee will have the option to move the skater into the proper level, even if it is the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fairas possible to the competitors. It is an ethical violation for coaches to sandbag an event.

FEES REGISTRATION

Fees must accompany Entryeeze registration and be <u>Completed</u> and <u>Received</u> by March 1, 2023. Group ensembles are to register through the skating director by Team Coach. Event schedules will be e-mailed to the participant's coaches and posted at the arena one week prior to the event. Schedules will NOT be mailed to individual skaters.

JUDGING SYSTEM

The 6.0 Majority Judging System under Rule 1060 will be used for all events:

ADMISSION

No admission will be charged. All events are open to spectators.

CHECK IN

The official registration desk will be in the lobby of Sno-King Ice Arena. All competitors are required to check in 45 minutes prior to their scheduled event. participant's full name, level, coach's name, and running time. Events will not be delayed for skaters who arrive late.

VIDEOTAPING & PHOTOGRAPHY

No flash photography is permitted. Professional photographers will be offering Videos of the event as well as action shot photography. Information regarding ordering will be in the competition program.

SAFESPORT:

U.S. Figure Skating strives to provide a safe environment for its members that is free of misconduct and harassment. The <u>U.S. Center for SafeSport</u> is a national nonprofit organization providing education, resources, and training to promote respect and prevent abuse in sports.

At Sno-King arena's we require that our coaching staff and volunteers adhere to the Center's policies and procedures including the SafeSport Code. This does affect our protocol for locker rooms and changing areas. We encourage a coat or warm clothing to wear over the costume. We will have a Safesport monitor post. All staff and volunteers manning the post are SafeSport compliant. Parents are NOT allowed past the *post* for any reason to be compliant. Parent's assisting children will sign in at Safesport monitor station.

We encourage participants to arrive in costume and make-up. There will be assigned areas in which parents can assist children with getting skates on. No photography allowed in ANY of the locker rooms.

COACHES

For credentials at a Compete USA event, coaches/instructors are required to have:

- Learn to Skate USA instructorcompliant
 OR
- U.S. Figure Skating coach compliant

U.S. Figure Skating ethics and code of conduct rules and, as such, is subject todisciplinary action.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

• Events with large numbers of entries may be split into multiple groups. Large events will be split by age for Basic Skills through Preliminary.

- Event groups will not have more than 6 skaters. Warm-up groups may be skated with more than 6 skaters Two entries in a group will constitute an event. If only one entry is received in an event, the skater will have the option to skate an exhibition.
- This competition is governed by the current Compete USA manual.

Compete USA Competitions - Approvals

3111 Compete USA competitions may include eventsfor skaters who have passed no higher than the preliminary free skate, pre-bronze pattern dance oradult bronze free skate tests without applying for a

U.S. Figure Skating sanction. However, an approvalnumber is required and may be obtained from the appointed Learn to Skate USA representatives. Seealso rule 3112.

3112 When a Compete USA competition is heldin conjunction with a sanctioned nonqualifying competition, approval as required by rule 3111 above must still be obtained.

3120 Compete USA Competitions – Officials

3121 For Compete USA competitions, three judgesnot related to the competitors are required for each event. Judges may be any official U.S. Figure

Skating or Skate Canada judge or any other qualifiedeligible or ineligible person in skating who is a U.S. Figure Skating member and/or a Learn to Skate USAmember.

3122 For Compete USA competitions, the member club or other organization sponsoring and conducting the competition shall approve all judges and officials. All persons serving as judges and officials shall be at least 16 years of age.

3130 Compete USA Competitions – Announcements

3131 For all Compete USA competitions, a copy of the announcement and an approval request shall be sentto the appointed Learn to Skate USA representative for approval and issuance of a Compete USA approval number 30 days prior to the release of

the competition announcement to the public. The approval is to be publicly displayed during the competition.

3132 Compete USA competitions will follow the event structure as outlined in the Compete USA Manual. Any registered Learn to Skate USA program may conduct a Compete USA competition.

3133 When Compete USA competitions are held on the home ice of a U.S. Figure Skating memberclub, the member club shall be designated as thesponsoring club.

3134 Compete USA competitions may be:

A. "In house" — the competition is available only to those skaters who are members of the club or program conducting the competition, or B. "Open" — the competition is available to any reg-istered Learn to Skate USA member or full U.S. Figure Skating member.

3055 Entries

At nonqualifying competitions, if only one eligible competitor/team enters an event, the competitor/ team will be offered the option to skate an exhibition, compete in an equivalent event one level above or one level below (as qualified by test level) or, for

pre-juvenile and lower singles events, compete in an equivalent event against skaters of the oppositegender.

- A. If said competitor chooses to skate an exhibition, judges will award their marks according to the rules and the applicable judging system used, and the competitor/team will receive first place.
- B. If said competitor chooses to compete in an equivalent event against skaters of the oppositegender, the skater will be entered accordingly.
- C. If said competitor/team chooses not to skate, theentry fee will be refunded, and the event will be canceled

Eligibility- Rules for participants

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current members of either Learn to Skate USA and/or those who are full members of U.S.Figure Skating. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be a cur-rent registered member of Learn to Skate USA or a full member of U.S. Figure Skating. There will be no more than six competitors maximumin an event, and all six should receive an award.

ELIGIBILITY AND TEST REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All Snowplow Sam and Basic 1-6 skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher, and NO official U.S.Figure Skating tests may have been passed, including moves in the field or individual dances.

For the Pre-Free Skate, Free Skate 1-6, Excel, Well-Balanced, Adult and Adaptive levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest badge level or free skate test level passed. Skate Unit-ed skaters have the option to compete in the standard track or Skate United badge levels; accommodations may be made upon request. Moves in the field test level will not determine a skater's competitive level. Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher butnot both levels in the same event during the same competition. **For Synchronized Skating eligibility and requirements refer to the Synchronized Skating page.* *

FORMAT: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc., unless otherwise specified.

- To be skated on full ice with music
- The skater may use elements from a previous level
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level. Bonus skills from the same level or below are allowed but will not be judged elements
- Divide Snowplow Sam skaters by level (1-4), if registrations warrant
- Skaters with physical disabilities may register for standard track or Skate United Track for events

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Solo Pattern Dance

GENERAL EVENT PARAMETERS:

- Levels are based upon the skaters' highest pattern dance test passed
- A solo pattern dance competition event will consist of the skater performing two solo pattern dances
- The patterns to be skated depend upon which quarter of the year the competition is held. The skater will perform the two pattern dances listed for his/her level, based upon the date of the competition. If the competition falls over two quarters (for example, June 30–July 2), the dance will be selected based on the start date of the competition listed in the announcement (in this example, the second quarter).
- Skaters will complete both dances at each level. Dances will be scheduled at the discretion of the chief referee for each competi- tion and may be competed consecutively or with a break in-between pattern dance groupings.
- Skaters with physical disabilities may register for standard track or Skate United Track for events

Showcase Events

Showcase events are open to skaters in the Basic, Free Skate, limited beginner, preliminary and adult bronze levels. Groups will be divided by number of entries and ages if possible. Skaters with physical disabilities may register for standard track or Skate

United track. Skaters with intellectual disabilities may register for Special Olympics events. Skaters must enter at the same level as their free skate event or highest test level of skaters in the group ensemble or production number. If a free skate event is not being entered, skaters must enter at their current test level or one level higher.

Show costumes are permitted if they do not touch or drag on the ice. Costuming and make up for showcase programs should enhance the feeling created by the performance and reflect the meaning of the story or theme. Ornaments and hair accessories must be secure. No bobby pins, feathers, hair accessories or anything else that may fall to the ice and be hazardous to the skaters are allowed. (a 0.1 deduction will be taken). Props and scenery must be placed and removed by unaided singles and duet competitors within one minute on and off and by unaided ensemble contestants within two minutes for setup and two minutes for removal. A 0.1 deduction will be assessed by the referee against each judge's mark for every 10 seconds in excess of the time allowed for the performance, for handling props and scenery and for scenery assistance.

Performances will be judged from an entertainment standpoint for theatrical qualities. Technical skating skills and difficulty will not be rewarded as such; however, skating must be the major element of the performance and be of sufficient quality to support the selected theatrical elements. Unintended falls, poorly executed skating elements and obvious loss of control will reduce con- testant's marks. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in showcase; therefore jumps, if choreographed, should be performed with style, flow and confidence. Theatrical elements evaluated will include energy, poise, acting, pantomime, eye contact, choreography, form/extension and the use of props and ice. The 6.0 judging system will be used. Deductions will be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

* For specific guidelines regarding the conduct of showcase competitions, refer to the nonqualifying showcase guidelines posted on usfigureskating.org.

Showcase categories may include:

- Levels can be subdivided or combined, if necessary, depending on entry numbers and event set up to ensure performances are contested as per the guidelines. Example combined events: Character Performance and Comedic Impressions.
- Emotional (formerly Dramatic) Performance: Programs should portray a story, expressing conflict, resolution and/or depth of emotion. Skater should provoke an emotional response with the audience through related

skating movements, gestures

and choreographic processes. The entire spectrum of emotions should be considered when selecting the theme (e.g. love, loss, longing, fulfillment, happiness, melancholy, sadness, etc.).

- Lip synching is not permitted.
- Props and Scenery are permitted.
- No Technical Limitations.
- Character Performance: Skaters will impersonate a character, original or adapted, on the ice. Performances as a character from a movie, musical, book, original idea, original adaptation are all welcome here.

- Comedic Impressions: A humorous performance intentionally designed to achieve continuous/multiple chuckles, laughs, or audible rises from viewers. Performance is projected outward towards audience and entertaining through skating movements, gestures and physical actions deemed comedic.

 - Props and Scenery are permitted
 - No Technical Limitations
- Lyrical Pop: Perform to your favorite song containing lyrics, without lip-synching.
 - Lip synching is not permitted
 - Props and Scenery are not permitted

- Duets/Trios: Theatrical/artistic performances by 2 to 3 skaters.
- Mini production ensembles: Mini production ensembles: Theatrical performances by three to seven competitors. 2:00 maxi- mum length.
- Production ensembles: Production ensembles: Theatrical performances by eight to 30 skaters. 2:30 maximum length. NOTE: Skaters may only enter one duet, one mini production, and one production ensemble.

Interpretive

COMPETITION FORMAT:

The Organizing Committee must pre-select and edit musical choices appropriate for these events. During the warm-up, skaters will hear the selection of music twice. Following the warm-up, all skaters except for the first skater will be escorted to a soundproof lock- er room or another area of the arena. The first skater will hear the music one more time and then perform a program to the music. As each skater performs, the next skater in line will be allowed to hear the music for the third time before they perform to the music. The listening skater will not be allowed to view the performing skater.

Levels: Levels should be broken by ability with ages divided appropriately

Judging Rules: Skaters are judged on originality, pattern, technical (the ability to include jumps and spins) and music interpretation/ expression. Spins and jumps performed must be appropriate to competition level.

Time: Music Duration: Pre-Free Skate – Free Skate 6: 1:00 max. Beginner – Preliminary: 1:00 max

Coaching: There is to be no instruction allowed during this event from coaches, parents or fellow skaters. Staging area must be kept clear except for ice monitor and listening competitor.
