

Wasatch Freedom Classic COVID safety plan

Traffic flow





Registration/Checkin day of comp

Skaters will need to checkin at the registration table, no more than 1 hour prior to their scheduled event. Registration table will be located outside at the main entrance to the building. Skaters will be given color-coded wristbands that will determine when they may enter the building. Each group will be allowed into the building approximately 30 minutes prior to their scheduled event time. Each group will be assigned an area to leave their belongs as they move through from warm-up to the ice staging area just prior to their event. A volunteer will be stationed in each designated area to sanitize between groups and to help with moving people through their traffic flow. Volunteers will use sanitizing spray and sanitizing wipes that meet current CDC standards. Once a group is moved to the next waiting area, the area they have left will be sprayed and wiped down prior to a new group entering that space. Hand sanitizer will also be available at each designated waiting area. For more details see the traffic flow map.

Indoor warm ups will require skaters to remain masked during their warm ups. The volunteers will help to reinforce this. Skaters/coaches will be given a single chance to replace or place their mask on properly. If the do not or are disrespectful towards volunteers they will then be asked to leave. If the skater misses their event, their competition fees will not be refunded.

Code of Conduct Skater

Skaters will be asked to agree to a code of conduct at the time of registration for the competition. The code of conduct will require them to agree to remain masked at all times while inside the facility unless actively skating on the ice. The skater will agree that they understand the safety plan and that they are agreeing to abide by the safety plan. They will also be asked to agree that by attending this competition they are asserting that they are not experiencing any symptoms of COVID, have not been exposed to COVID in the two weeks prior to the event, have not tested positive for COVID in the two weeks prior to the event, do not have a household member who has tested positive for COVID in the two weeks prior to the event, or that neither they nor another member of their household is awaiting results for a COVID test. Possible symptoms of COVID include but are not limited to:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat

- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Skaters

Skaters maybe accompanied by one coach and two chaperones. This is to ensure social distance and the safety of our young skaters. Masks will be required at all times in the building by chaperones, coaches, and skaters. This is in accordance with current USFSA guidelines and regulations for sanctioned events. Skaters, coaches, and chaperones will be given one warning. After that if they do not comply or are disrespectful towards volunteers or competition committee members they will be asked to leave. If a skater is asked to leave prior to skating their event(s) resulting in that skater missing their event, their registration fees will not be refunded. Skaters will be permitted to remove masks during their performance. Masks maybe required during warm-ups, depending on current transmission levels. Every effort will be made to ensure safety and allow skaters to remove masks while actively skating on the ice. Skaters will need to arrive dressed and ready to skate. There will be no locker rooms available. Skaters will need to leave the building once they have skated for their event.

Observers/Audience

After viewing their skater's event chaperones need to leave the building. Chaperones are required to wear a mask at all times inside the building. Chaperones members will be given one warning. After that if they do not comply or are disrespectful towards volunteers or competition committee members they will be asked to leave. This is a private event hosted by the Wasatch Figure Skating Club and sanctioned by USFSA. Thus audience and participants will need to follow the rules set forth in this safety plan. There will be no medical exemptions to allow for not masking at this event. This is in accordance with current USFSA guidelines for sanctioned events. Every effort will be made to obtain live streaming for friends and family who are unable to attend.

Masks

Masks must meet current CDC guidelines, and must be worn in a manner that covers the nose and is firmly secured under the chin. Masks must be worn regardless of vaccination status, per current USFSA guidelines, regardless of current state or county guidelines or mandates. USFSA does not allow for medical exemption for masks. As this is a private event, USFSA can make requirements for participation that may differ from local mandates/rules. If a skater or coach cannot mask due to medical issues, then they are encouraged to participate via virtual events.

Awards

A podium for award pictures will be provided. It will be located in doors at the entrance to the Mustangs stadium. The awards table will be in the same location. Results will be posted online. A link to the IJS live results will be located on the club website.

Officials

Officials will be required to remain masked while in the facility. We will be using all local officials, so that no one is traveling from out of state. Officials will be provided with boxed lunches. During lunch and breaks judges will be given a minimum of 6 feet distance between themselves to allow for eating and hydration. Every effort will be made to maintain adequate social distancing while actively judging. Tables for the judges will be set to allow for maximum distance between the judges. Volunteers will be assigned to sanitize the judges area whenever there is a transition in judges. This will include wiping down all surfaces with sanitizing wipes or alcohol based sanitizing wipes that meet the minimum 70% alcohol concentration as recommended by the CDC. Hand sanitizer will also be available at each judge's station and in the judges break area.
