Virtual Testing FAQ

What is a virtual test session?

- USFS has developed a virtual environment in response to restrictions and limited availability of judges during the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - Judges are still confirmed for this test session but will not be onsite.

What should I do BEFORE recording a test?

• Refer to the instructions that are provided on the Forestwood <u>Entryeeze</u> homepage, and the Forestwood website. <u>www.forestwoodskatingclub.com</u>

What forms are required to complete?

- Affidavit for Virtual Test Submission (USFS Requirement) This form must be signed by skater, coach and videographer, and proctor.
 - Name and Likeness Release and Consent Agreement (USFS Requirement) Release for

video recordings.

Who is a Test Proctor?

• The proctor must be an impartial person of authority (i.e., rink management, skating school director or local skating official) but may NOT be a coach/choreographer who has worked with the athlete, training mate or a parent/guardian (of the athlete or any training mates).

Can the test be recorded more than once?

• Yes, but only 1 video submission per test will be accepted.

Can I record my test and submit for judging without a registration or affidavits?

• No – Complete registration is required.

How far ahead can I record my test?

- The test can be recorded up to 30 days prior to the test deadline of the test session using the USFS Virtual Testing Video Requirements.
- Only one video will be submitted to the judges.

How will the judges score my test?

- Upon completion of all tests, video links will be uploaded for judges to view.
- Judges follow USFS virtual judging guidelines.
- Skater's video is viewed once and score just like if they were observing you at the rink.
- Comments and scores are required to be entered in a paper form. Judges are required

to scan/photograph test results and send back using approved USFS protocols.

When will I get my test results?

- Once the videos are uploaded and judges informed, we expect to have the results backs within one week.
- Club test chair will follow the recently established protocols of emailing both coaches

and skaters the PDF file asap, and recording with the USFSA
