Why Compete?

ISI Recreational Ice Skating Competitions are team-based events that encourage skaters of all ages, skill levels, and abilities to participate.

During the competition, skaters are placed into event groups based on similar age and ability levels, with a maximum of nine entries per group. Skaters earn team points for both their placement and participation in each event, along with individual medals or awards. At the conclusion of each competition, trophies are awarded to the teams that accumulate the most points.

Even if a skater does not place when competing against others, they still experience a strong sense of involvement as a contributing team member. Team spirit is fostered, and the focus remains on the excitement and fun of participation rather than solely on winning. Every skater in every event receives a medal at ISI competition events.

- DATES:** Friday April 17, 2026 - Sunday April 19, 2026
- LOCATION:** TBSA Oldsmar 255 Forest Lakes Blvd, Oldsmar, FL 34677
- FACILITY:** Tampa Bay Skating Academy is a twin sheet facility. The ice surface measures 200' X 85'. Locker rooms will be available for skaters to change. Locker rooms will be separated by age and gender in accordance with Safe Sport Rules. Only one same sex parent may assist their child in the locker room if the child is under 11 years of age. Adult skaters ages 18 and up will have a separate locker room for changing and are permitted to change in the adult locker room only.
- ENTRY DEADLINE:** Entries must be received by March 6, 2026. There will be NO REFUNDS.
- The first individual event fee is \$88.00. Each additional event is \$25. Hospitality/Administrative fee of \$18 per individual skater. Partnered events, including dance, require both partners to register and pay the individual event fee.
- Team entry fee is \$25 per skater plus a processing fee of \$5.00 per team.
- Late entries, if accepted after entry deadline, will be doubled.
- ENTRY FORM:** Application available on Entryeeze: www.entryeeze.com
- Payment will be accepted on Entryeeze.
- EVENT SCHEDULE:** The skaters' list will be available 30 days prior to the event. The schedule will be sent two weeks prior to the event. Updated schedules will be sent via email. The final event schedule will be sent to the team coach and skaters no later than one week prior to the competition. Please check with your coach or your email for the schedule.
- ELIGIBILITY:** Skaters must have a current ISI membership. All entrants must be registered to their highest test level with the ISI on or before March 6, 2026. All competitors must compete at their highest passed test level and comply with equivalence chart levels. Ages for the purposes of grouping will be the skater's age as of April 17, 2026. Events are offered to all ages, Tots to Adults.
- Members of USFS, who are individual or professional members of ISI and have all their ISI tests passed and registered with ISI headquarters, are eligible to compete in accordance with the ISI/USFS joint statement of policy. Please see the conversion chart. USFS and ISI adult skaters (age 21 and over) may petition the ISI Headquarters for permission to compete lower than levels listed on the conversion chart.
- WAIVER:** Upon entering the competition, I or my minor skater agree to enter this competition at mine or their own risk and hereby release ISI, TBSA Oldsmar, IcePlex Land Assets and their owners, officers, directors, officials, and personnel from all liability.
- I declare that the home rink selected in my registration is the true rink/club/school that I wish to represent.
- Upon entering this competition, I hereby agree that any photographs or video taken of me by ISI or IcePlex Land Assets authorized parties may be used exclusively for any purpose by the ISI or IcePlex Land Assets for any other use authorized by the ISI or IcePlex Land Assets. I declare that the information above is true and that all skaters entering have a current individual membership with ISI.

COMPETITION STANDARDS:

The ISI Spring Fling Competition will be conducted in accordance with the ISI rules and regulation set forth in the 2024 ISI Handbook and any current ISI updates. Events are offered to all ages, Tots through Adults. Artistic Skating, Couples, Rhythmic (Ribbon, Ball and Hoop), Pairs, Dance (Solo & Mixed), Open Solo Free Dance, Solo Compulsories (PA-FS10), Ensemble, Jump & Spin, Freestyle (Tots, Pre-Alpha through Delta, Freestyle 1-10, Open Freestyle (Bronze-Platinum), Footwork, Interpretive, Stroking (Pre-Alpha through Delta), Synchronized Team Compulsories & Freeskate (Skating & Formation), Team Compulsories, Spotlight (Individual, Couple & Family)-Character, Light Entertainment & Dramatic. Skaters will be divided by age, level, and gender.

MUSIC:

All programs must be electronically submitted by March 21, 2026, through Entryeeze.

Electronic submission can be made in the following manner:

Music must be in an audio file format (mp3).

Music file should be. Labeled with skater's name, event name, and arena (team) name.

Music should be uploaded to Entryeeze via a computer not a mobile phone. If you have an android, make sure to download your music via an email on your computer and then upload it to the site. To avoid sound distortion do not use music that has been downloaded directly to a phone and then emailed. ONLY use music emailed from a computer to another computer.

Please make sure to have back-up music available on your phone in case of technical difficulties.

REGISTRATION: The registration desk will open on Friday, April 17, 2026, one hour prior to the start of the first event and will remain open until the end of the day's events. Remember, competition events can run up to one hour early. Please arrive at the rink no less than 90 minutes prior to your event time. All competitors should check in with registration upon arrival to pick up their competitor's packet. This includes all synchronized and production team members even if they are not competing in an individual event. Competitors should check-in with the ice monitor no less than one event prior to their event.

JUDGES: All judges must be certified at one of the following levels: Bronze, Silver, Gold, or Synchro. All judges must also have completed the 2024 ISI Judge's update test. All judges and coaches must be current ISI professional members. No individual will be allowed to judge an event where a relative is a participant. Only coaches with valid credentials will be allowed to put skaters on the ice for events.

ACCOUNTING REVIEW: Coaches and Parents are not to question anyone from the judges panel about results. Concerns regarding results are to be directed to the Competition Director. Requests for competition review must be made in writing by the coach no more than 1 hour after the results have been posted. Per ISI rules only the accounting will be reviewed and retabulated. Only the Accountant and the Competition director will be permitted to review the judges' sheets. A \$50 Accounting Review fee is due prior to the review. Should the re-tabulation result in an adjustment, the \$50 fee will be refunded. The affected skater will be awarded the correct placement. However, skaters in the original tabulation will not be denied their original placements.

AWARDS: Individual Awards for all placements will be a medal.

ISI SPRING FLING EVENTS DESCRIPTIONS

General information is listed below for each event to be offered at our ISI competition.

Please refer to the current edition of the 2024 ISI Handbook for more complete event details and performance guidelines.

ARTISTIC SOLO 1-10

Skaters perform a program to music with emphasis on strong edges, flow, choreography, innovative moves, and musical interpretation. There is no score for technical ability in this event. Event level is based on skater's freestyle test level.

COUPLES 1-10 SIMILAR / MIXED

Two skaters perform their routine to music that requires maneuvers from their current Couples test level. This event is like a Freestyle skating program by two skaters in unison. Both skaters must pass the required Couples test to compete in this event.

COUPLES SPOTLIGHT – LOW / BRONZE / SILVER / GOLD / PLATINUM

An entertaining spotlight program performed by two skaters using costumes and props. Couples will also be divided into Character / Dramatic / Light Entertainment categories so please select the correct category on Entryeze.

DANCE 1-10 SOLO & PARTNER DANCE SIMILAR, MIXED, PRO PARTNER

This is the skater's version of Ballroom Dancing. Test levels begin with basic steps and patterns and then advance to high performance level. All skaters must pass the required dance test to compete in these events. Ice Dancing can be enjoyed at any age or level. Skaters are not required to pass the Delta test to participate in Ice Dance Events. Skaters are no longer required to pass the entire dance level test for the next higher level before competing individual dances from the next higher level that have already been passed. All dancers can choose to compete in any or all dances from their highest completed test level. A separate event entry fee is required for each dance selected.

Professionals and their students can compete together in the Pro Partner dance events at the student's current Ice Dance test level. The Professional must be a current ISI Professional member but does not have to pay any entry fees for the event. The Professional will not receive any medal for Pro Partner dance events participation.

ENSEMBLE

This event is open to groups of 3-7 skaters of all levels and ages. Skaters will be judged on the performance value of the program. There are no required maneuvers, no maneuver limitations and there is no technical score for this event.

The group should use music, costumes, and props to enhance the theme while creating an entertaining performance. The costume and prop guidelines are the same as for Solo Spotlight events. Props are not allowed on warm-up. Event groups are divided by number of skaters first and then by age, if necessary. Duration: 3 minutes.

FAMILY SPOTLIGHT (ALL LEVELS)

Two or more family members can perform an entertaining spotlight routine using costumes & props. If necessary, the event groupings are divided by number of skaters first and then by age, if necessary.

Duration: 1.5 minutes

FOOTWORK 1-10

Freestyle skaters perform a one-minute program to music using various turns and connecting steps with limited jumps or spins. Skaters are judged on correct turns and edges as well as flow, variety of moves and choreography. Duration: 1 minute

FREE DANCE 1-10

The ISI Free Dance events are based on the Free Dance test levels (1-10). Each couple must pass the corresponding test level to compete in Free Dance events. For the competition event, each skater or couple must perform a free dance program of their own design. It should express the skater's or couple's inspirational and artistic capabilities.

FREESTYLE 1-10

A program performed to music with emphasis on the required test level maneuvers from the skater's current Freestyle level. Various skills are required, depending on the test level. All skaters must pass the Freestyle test level to compete in this event.

FREESTYLE SYNCHRO TEAM 1-10

Three to seven skaters from the same Freestyle level can enter this new form of group skating. They must perform the same identical Freestyle program in unison. All test level requirements must be included. All skaters must have passed the same Freestyle test level to compete together in this event.

INTERPRETIVE 1-10 (Freestyle Levels only)

Freestyle level skaters will hear a piece of music once off the ice, twice during the group, warm-up, and once more before competing while they mentally choreograph a skating routine, with no help from friends, parents, or coaches. The emphasis is on the skater's ability to choreograph an entertaining skating routine to music, and not on the difficulty of the skating maneuvers performed.

JUMP & SPIN (Tot – Freestyle 10)

Two skaters enter the ice as a team. Each skater performs their choice of a required jump or spin two times. Only the best attempt of each required element will be judged. Only the technical accuracy of the required element is judged, the difficulty of the chosen element is not considered. If two skaters from different category levels wish to compete together, the team will be entered at the highest level of the two skaters.

Category Levels:

Low	Both skaters must be in Tot to Delta levels only.
Bronze	Both skaters must be in Freestyle 1-3 / Bronze levels or below.
Silver	Both skaters must be in Freestyle 4-5 / Silver levels or below.
Gold	Both Skaters must be in Freestyle 6-7 / Gold levels of below.
Platinum	Both skaters must be in Freestyle 8-10 / Platinum levels or below.

KALEIDOSKATE (ALL LEVELS)

A group of eight or more skaters perform a fun and entertaining group number. Minimal skating skills are required for this event. Each skater represents a piece of color, those pieces are used to choreograph and create constantly changing patterns, designs, and formations on the ice. Creativity, use of color and props are an important part of the overall design.

OPEN FREESTYLE – Bronze, Silver, Gold & Platinum (Short and Long)

There are no required moves for the open freestyle events. Any spin can be performed at any level, but all skaters and coaches should carefully check the jump limitations for Bronze, Silver and Gold levels. The program should be well – balanced including jumps, spins, connecting moves, gliding, maneuvers, etc.

Skaters who have passed the traditional ISI Freestyle 1–10 tests are not required to take any additional tests to compete at the required level of Open Freestyle.

Skaters who have passed tests from another skating organization are only required to take the equivalent level of test. In some cases, competitors may decide to test to a higher Open Freestyle level than their current ISI test level, based on their current program content.

Open Freestyle judging criteria includes Correctness of Jumps, Correctness of Spins, Correctness of Turns and Edges, Variety of Moves, Music interpretation, Posture, Choreography & Pattern, Presentation, Duration, and General Overall (by all 3 Judges).

OPEN PAIR – Bronze, Silver, Gold & Platinum

There are no required maneuvers for the open pair event; but all skaters and coaches should carefully check the maneuver limitations for the Bronze, Silver and Gold levels. The program should be well – balanced, and include jumps, spins, pair lifts, pair spins, footwork, and connecting moves.

Skaters who have passed the traditional ISI Pair 1–10 test are not required to take any additional tests to compete at the equivalent level of the Open Pair event.

Skaters who have passed tests from other skating organizations are only required to take the equivalent level test to compete at that level. In some cases, skaters will have to test and enter a higher Open Pair level – based on their current program content.

Open pair event judging criteria includes Correctness of Jumps, Correctness of Spins, Correctness of Turns and Edges, Variety of Moves, Music Interpretation, Posture, Choreography & Pattern, Presentation, Duration, and General Overall (by all 3 Judges).

PAIR 1-10

Together skaters perform a choreographed routine to music. This program must include all the required maneuvers from their current Pair Test level. The event is similar to Couples. However, unlike Couples, Pairs include pair lifts and pair spins. Both skaters must pass the required Pairs Test to compete in this event.

PATTERN SKATING (Delta level and above)

This unique form of group skating is done by at least four people. Working off a common circle, skaters, draw patterns, formations, and designs on the ice to music. The skaters skate in unison, doing the same thing at the same time, each in their own area of the pattern. All kinds of maneuvers can be performed. i.e., jumps/spins/footwork/spirals/etc., if the circular symmetry is predominantly evident throughout the routine.

PRE ALPHA – DELTA SOLO

Skaters perform a one-minute program routine to music that emphasizes the required test level maneuvers from Pre-Alpha through Delta. Depending on each test level requirement, specific skating skills must be performed. All skaters must pass the Pre-Alpha – Delta test to compete in this level. Skaters must include one maneuver from Freestyle 1 in their program.

PRODUCTION TEAM (All Levels)

This team event is for groups of eight or more skaters. The team will be judged on the performance value of the program. There are no required maneuvers, and no technical score for this event. The group should use music along with elaborate costumes and props to enhance the theme while creating an entertaining performance. Skaters from all levels can participate in this event. Events will be divided into Small / Medium / Large / Extravaganza categories, as registration warrants.

RHYTHMIC SKATING

This event requires the use of one handheld prop: ball, hoop, or ribbon. The program should contain elements and employ the use of the prop throughout the routine. Props of the same kind, (i.e., ball / hoop / ribbon) must be grouped together and cannot be combined for a competition event group. Props are not allowed on the event warm up. If it is obvious that the skater's prop does not meet the following specifications, the panel referee can determine if any point deduction should be taken.

Choice of One:

1. Hoop must be made of plastic or wood from a rigid, non-bending material. The hoop diameter should measure between 2 feet 7 inches-2 feet 11 inches. The hoop can have colored tape or fabric to match or contrast to skater's costume, but it cannot have any other decorations (i.e., fringe, lights, etc. on the prop.)
2. Ball must be made of rubber or plastic. The ball diameter should measure approximately 7 3/4 inches. The ball must be smooth (without any texture).
3. Ribbon Stick must be made of wood, plastic, or fiberglass. Stick length should be between 20 and 30 inches. Ribbon material must be one piece of satin or non-static fabric. Ribbon width should be two to four inches wide and between 6-9 feet long as proportional to the size and the ability of the skater.

SOLO COMPULSORIES (Pre-Alpha – Freestyle 1-10)

2025-2026 ISI National Events — Selected Maneuvers

Skaters are to perform only the three maneuvers below, in any order, with a minimum of connecting steps. Each maneuver may only be attempted once. Additional maneuvers, such as any jump, spin, or gliding maneuvers from any test level, or any uncaptured moves are not allowed.

Please Note: There is no penalty given for the quantity of swizzles, wiggles, strokes, or crossovers in the Pre-Alpha – Beta levels. Only the quality of these maneuvers are comparatively judged.

SPECIAL SKATER 1-10

This category is open to skaters of all ages with physical or mental disabilities. Skaters will perform a program to music for one minute that includes all the compulsory moves from their test level. Skaters will be grouped by age, gender, and disability classification. The special skater's event is based on the ISI Special Skater event levels 1 through 10. These tests must be registered with the ISI national office.

Above the Special Skater 10 level, special skaters can take and pass their test levels in Freestyle, Figures, Couples, Pairs, Dance and Free Dance so they are eligible to compete in those levels- along with Artistic, Footwork, Interpretive, etc. If requested the competition director can put special skaters into a separate event group for these events.

SPOTLIGHT SOLO PROGRAM (All Levels)

This is an entertaining and fun routine that emphasizes the skaters' acting ability and not technical skating skills. There is no score for technical merit. The skater must pass a test for Tots, Pre Alpha to Delta or Freestyle 1-10 to determine the spotlight entry level. Spotlight events are divided into 3 categories. Please mark the correct category on the entry form. Costume and props are part of the judging criteria; props are encouraged but not required. Please follow the timed guidelines for getting props on and off the ice.

- A) Character Spotlight should be a famous or easily identifiable character.
- B) Dramatic Spotlight should be a theatrical performance that sets a mood and evokes an emotional response.
- C) Light Entertainment should be an entertaining or lighthearted performance.

STROKING (Pre-Alpha-Delta Only)

Skaters compete together in groups wearing colored numbers for easy identification by the judges. They do only forward stroking in both directions and are judged on posture and correct stroking technique. Crossovers are required for Alpha and above and will be judged. This is the very basic skill of skating.

SYNCHRONIZED COMPULSORIES-Formation / Skating

Synchronized Formation and Skating teams must perform four or five required elements to music with no additional moves permitted. Teams will be divided by age groups. For details of compulsory maneuvers and program duration limitations please see the current edition of the ISI handbook book.

SYNCHRONIZED TEAM – Dance / Formation / Skating

This is a group of eight or more skaters to perform in unison. They can incorporate various skating formations such as circles, pinwheels, lines, footwork sequences and dance steps. For complete description of Formation, Skating, and Dance categories, please see the current edition of the ISI handbook.

TEAM COMPULSORIES 1-10 (Freestyle Levels Only)

Six skaters (or seven skaters for freestyle 6- 10 levels) perform a lively and entertaining routine in which each skater performs one required test level maneuver in the order listed in the current edition of the ISI handbook. Lively music with entertaining themes, great costumes, and handheld props are featured in this event. Skaters can compete on more than one team given; those two teams are in different freestyle levels. Skaters may skate above, but not below, their own freestyle test level.

THEATER PRODUCTION

The theater production event is for an entire skating team. Skaters of all ages and ability levels can participate in this theatrical team event. This is a creative and artistic program usually based on a story or theme, using costumes, props, and technical skating to enhance the production performance.

THEMED COUPLES SPOTLIGHT / THEMED PRODUCTION/ THEMED SOLO SPOTLIGHT (All Levels)

2026 ISI Theme

This event will use the same guidelines as regular Couple Spotlight, Production Teams and Solo Spotlight events regarding levels, maneuver limitations, duration, and costume / prop restrictions. All programs in this category must relate to the national event theme.

TOT 1-4

Tots (skaters aged 6 and under) will perform a one-minute program routine with music. They should only perform the required maneuvers from their test level. Additional maneuvers should not be included and will not be judged. 2 foot and / or 1 foot snowplow stops are permitted in Tot events.

All Tot competitors must have their current test registered with ISI to enter Tot competition events. Coaches will be allowed on the with skates on or may help from the entrance door.
